Thank you for your interest in a Wildlife Management degree from Tarleton State University through our Animal Sciences Department.

The wildlife program at Tarleton offers the opportunity to extend your education beyond the classroom through hands-on activities both on the university's nearby Hunewell Ranch and local private ranches. Students are also given the chance for professional development and networking through membership in the Tarleton Student Chapter of The Wildlife Society.

Tarleton offers students a degree in Wildlife Management that will lay the educational groundwork for becoming a Certified Wildlife Biologist through The Wildlife Society.
