- I. Catalog Description: The field of aviation has developed its own distinctive body of statutes, treaties, regulation and case law. Each of these areas will be studied as well as specialized rules and laws that have been developed because of the distinctive nature of the airplane as a mode of transportation. Both the "text method" and "case method" will be used in the course of instruction.
- II. Prerequisites: None
- III. Expanded Course Description: Aviation law acquaints the student with the framework for developing a greater understanding of the principles of Aviation Law as it related to domestic and international operations.
- IV. Intended Student Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:
 - A. Demonstrate an increased awareness of the concepts of law as they apply to aviation operations.
 - B. Research and find case laws as they relate to aviation matters.
 - C. Apply an increased understanding of FAA regulations and civil law as they apply to individuals and corporations.
