- I. Catalog Description: This course provides a closely supervised experience in aviation management in an aviation related job workplace. Suggested areas of internship assignments are found in air carrier operations, airport management in airport terminals, flight instruction schools, and fixed-base operations. Management problems and employee responsibilities are implemented, as well as customer service situations.
- II. Prerequisites: Aviation Science Major, senior classification
- III. Expanded Course Description: The internship assignment acquaints the student with the framework for developing a greater understanding of workplace principles as they relate to the workplace environment. Students will become better acquainted with the responsibilities required in the aviation workplace that will be required of graduates.
- IV. Intended Student Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:
  - A. Demonstrate an increased awareness of the concepts of the workplace environment as they apply to aviation operations.
