406-3 Commodity Futures Markets. (3-0) Introduction to the organization and functioning of futures markets. Analysis of the economic function performed by markets, and study of fundamental and technical approaches to market forecasting. Examination of various trading strategies applied primarily to agricultural commodities. Prerequisite Course(s): AEC 105: Introductory Agricultural Economics and ECO 202: Principles of Economics: Micro and AEC 212: Microcomputer Applications in Agriculture and AEC 314: The Agricultural Marketing System
