203-3 Basic Horsemanship. (1-4) Instruction and practice of basic horsemanship skills. Focus will be on the proper use of feet, seat, hands and legs to provide the horse with the correct stimulus to perform basic maneuvers. Prerequisite Course(s): ANSC 109: Introduction to Horse Production
