331-3 Advanced Equine Assisted Therapy. (1-4) Advanced studies in the use of the horse in a therapeutic riding program. Students will gain the hands-on experience and the information about riding, instruction and safety necessary to become a Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor with the North American Riding for the Handicapped Association. Course fee \$10. Prerequisite Course(s): ANSC 109: Introduction to Horse Production and ANSC 330: Equine Assisted Therapy and approval of the instructor.

In course descriptions, the digit following the course number is the number of semester credit hours. For example, ENGL 111-3 is a freshman level course worth 3 semester hours of credit. The numbers in parentheses following the course number (for example, 3-2) indicate the number of clock hours per week devoted to theory and practice, respectively.
