

## Nursing

**309-4 Nursing Care of Children and Adolescents. (2-6)** Focuses on chronic illness, disabilities and end-of-life issues of children and adolescents. Developmental vulnerabilities of childhood are considered. Emphasizes age and culturally sensitive care and communication with children, and their families. Clinical experiences in acute care and community settings incorporate an interdisciplinary approach in the delivery of care to children and adolescents. Course fee \$20. Lab fee \$10. Prerequisite Course(s): NUR 201: Foundations of Nursing Practice and NUR 205: Clinical Pharmacology and Pathophysiology and NUR 215: Physical Assessment and Documentation

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In course descriptions, the digit following the course number is the number of semester credit hours. For example, ENGL 111-3 is a freshman level course worth 3 semester hours of credit. The numbers in parentheses following the course number (for example, 3-2) indicate the number of clock hours per week devoted to theory and practice, respectively.
