**425-3 Population Health Nursing. (2-3)** Focuses on the aggregate, community, or population as the unit of care. Emphasis is placed on epidemiology, health promotion, disease and injury prevention. Clinical experiences occur in a variety of community settings. Course fee \$20. Lab fee \$10. Prerequisite Course(s): NUR 301: Family Health Nursing and NUR 325: Scholarly Inquiry in Nursing and NUR 411: Nursing Research

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In course descriptions, the digit following the course number is the number of semester credit hours.
