310-3 Wildlife Management Techniques. (2-2-WI) Field and laboratory techniques used in wildlife management and research. Determining age and food habits, population analysis, habitat analysis, and introduction to research. Credit for both R&RM 310 and WLDM 310 will not be awarded. Course fee \$5. Prerequisite Course(s): WLDM 221: Wildlife Conservation and Management and one semester statistics. Modest costs of field trips will be borne by the student.

In course descriptions, the digit following the course number is the number of semester credit hours. For example, ENGL 111-3 is a freshman level course worth 3 semester hours of credit. The numbers in parentheses following the course number (for example, 3-2) indicate the number of clock hours per week devoted to theory and practice, respectively. (WI) indicates that sections of this course will be offered as writing intensive.
