

ASK YOUR LIAISON ABOUT THESE LIBRARY SERVICES

- ◆ **Acquisition** and selection of new titles depend on recommendations from the faculty for items that support departmental curriculum and research. Librarians will work closely with you to ensure ample coverage in your discipline and help you stay informed about acquisition and collection concerns.
- ◆ **Course Reserves/E-Reserves** let you place library materials, past exams, personal copies, and supplemental readings for your students at the circulation desk or online. We comply with fair use and copyright regulations. We can also assist you with copyright issues as needed.
- ◆ **Databases/E-Journals** provide full-text articles and citations in all subject areas. You can access these materials from any location 24 hours a day.
- ◆ **Distance Education Services** offer document delivery to faculty and students who participate in remote and/or online courses and do not attend class, work, or live in Stephenville.
- ◆ **Interlibrary Loan (ILLiad)** lets you request materials from other libraries if the Tarleton Libraries' collections do not offer the resources you need. ILLiad keeps track of your requests and each item's bibliographic information.
- ◆ **Library Sessions** offer course-integrated instruction for using library tools, resources and databases. Lecture or hands-on instruction sessions can be held in the library, your classroom, or a campus computer lab.
- ◆ **Online Search Tools** provide ready access to materials: SFX offers an easy way to locate full-text journal titles. MetaLib offers a single interface to simultaneously search multiple databases and the library catalog.
- ◆ **Reference Assistance** is offered in the library or your office, online, and by phone.

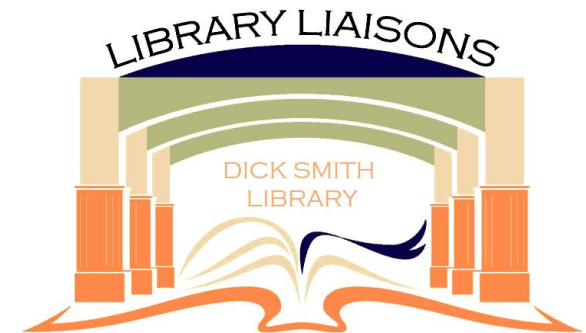

WHAT IS THE LIBRARY LIAISON PROGRAM?

Professional librarians, designated as “library liaisons,” are assigned to specific academic departments to offer faculty personalized assistance with and information about library services, collections, policies, and resources.

PURPOSE:

To foster effective communication between the Dick Smith Library and the University’s academic departments in order to

- 1) Enhance library services in response to the needs of academic programs.
- 2) Keep Tarleton State University’s community of faculty, students, and staff informed about available library services and resources.

GOALS:

The Library Liaison Program is designed to

- Provide a primary contact for departmental faculty regarding library-related issues, research consultation, suggestions, and policy interpretation.
- Promote library information services and resources to the academic departments and faculty.
- Increase librarians’ awareness of faculty and departmental needs for teaching and research in order to strategically develop library services.
- Enhance the role of librarians as advocates for library services through increased collaboration with the academic departments.
- Assist departmental faculty in strengthening library collections for their specific disciplines.
- Work with faculty to make information fluency an essential component of students’ learning.
