

Greetings!

The Division of Research, Innovation and Economic Development welcomes you to the first edition of *RIED Quarterly*, a digital newsletter of the research-related events, activities and awards at Tarleton State University. RIED has undergone several changes since its inception in February under the leadership of Vice President for Research, Innovation and Economic Development Dr. Rupa lyer, and we're highlighting those exciting changes here.

President's Excellence in Research Scholars (PERS)

The President's Excellence in Research Scholars opportunity was awarded in May, providing funding internally to generate innovative learning experiences through research, technology and other resources. Fifty-one applications were awarded, totaling \$775,971 for projects across six colleges, TIAER, Academic Affairs and the Small Business Development Center. Some examples of these projects with crossdisciplinary topics:



Evaluation of a Novel, Plant-based Drug Delivery System in a Pig Model. This study will examine a plant-based food-grade polymer fenugreek in the oral administration of insulin. Data generated will be statistically analyzed to determine the significance of the study. It also will be used to pursue external funding. Research will be done between Drs. Rajani Srinivasan and Kimberly Guay.

Estimating Health Disparity in Texas: The Case of Orthopedic Surgeons Access of Orthopedists for Texans. State-of-the-art methods will be used to estimate the supply of and demand for orthopedic surgeons in a county. These figures will help bridge the healthcare disparity gap between urban and rural areas. Research will be done between Drs. Syed Jafri and Edward Osei.

Rural Demand Forecast Projection. This study is to help aspiring entrepreneurs within the immediate, rural area who find it difficult to obtain capital. Data will be collected from established businesses from across the United States focusing on dollar amounts from business transactions, average price per transaction, as well as demographics associated with sales. Having defendable projection numbers will increase the likelihood of entrepreneurs receiving the necessary capital from lenders to successfully start and maintain their business ideas. Research will be done between Bill Leaverton and Dr. Scott Cook.

Meet the New RIED Staff Members


Enrollment numbers aren't the only thing growing at Tarleton as RIED has seen an increase in staffing to better serve the research administration needs of our faculty.
