Bob Heinonen has been educating and entertaining Texans of all ages for many years by portraying Texas heroes. In 1990 he founded the Texana Living History Association, a non-profit corporation. He guided and promoted Texana to become "one of the leading forces in the state in the teaching of Texas history." In March 2001, Heinonen fulfilled a dream by forming Texas Heroes, a professional troupe of historians/actors who portray heroes and heroines in the first-person.

For the dinner he will portray Charles Goodnight. Charles Goodnight was born in Illinois just as Texas won its independence -- 1836. His family came to Texas just as Texas became a state -- 1845. By the time he was 20, he got into the cattle business and went on to become the most revered cattleman in Texas history. He blazed new cattle trails like the Goodnight-Loving Trail and founded one of the most important cattle ranches in American history -- the JA Ranch in the Palo Duro Canyon.

Make reservations now to see and hear Heinonen's portrayal of Charles Goodnight in our newly renovated library. It is estimated that Heinonen has performed for over 360,000 students and tens of thousands of adults all over Texas.
