

Chemical Society Receives Honors at the 237th American Chemical Society National Meeting and Exposition in Salt Lake City – Spring 2009

The American Chemical Society is the world's largest scientific society. More than 13,000 members attended this annual meeting. Tarleton's Student Affiliate Chapter of the Society received a plaque honoring it as a Commendable Chapter for the 2007-2008 academic year. Of the more than 900 chapters in the United States and Puerto Rico, only about 50 were honored.

Students attending the meeting included chapter president Cody Anderson, vice-president Eric Poindexter, and members Travis Figg, Laura Rogers and Clifford Terrell. The students were accompanied by chapter sponsor Dr. Peter Bell and faculty members Dr. Linda Schultz and Dr. Lance Whaley.
