

Presidential Honors Scholarships

THE JOY GALLANT ARCHER SCHOLARSHIP

The Joy Gallant Archer Scholarship was established in 1999 by a gift from the will of Joy Gallant Archer. Mrs. Archer, who died at the age of 83, was a private individual who had little formal education and worked hard for what she achieved in life. Mrs. Archer appreciated the financial and moral support she had received from her family throughout her life and felt it was important to set up a system to provide support for young people seeking educational opportunities. Mrs. Archer was born in Kennard and was the fourth of ten children. She pursued occupations as a beautician and real estate agent and was also a housemother at the State School for the Deaf in Austin. Mrs. Archer resided in Gustine until her death in January of 1999.

EDWARD L. (LARRY) BICKET SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

Established in 1989 by Edward and Cindy Bicket, this scholarship is awarded to a deserving student in the Presidential Honors Program at Tarleton.

THE DANIEL ROSS CARPENTER SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. & Mrs. Harley Carpenter of Stephenville established the Daniel Ross Carpenter Scholarship in 1989 in memory of their son, Daniel Ross Carpenter. Daniel attended Tarleton State University for three years. He was killed in an automobile accident while traveling to Lubbock. Mr. Harley Carpenter, who died in February 1993, was an oil consultant and a Navy veteran of World War II.

THE FREDERICK THOMAS AND MADELINE TOLKSDORF CRIMMINS

ENDOWED CRIMINAL JUSTICE SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. & Mrs. Carl Crimmins of Stephenville, as a memorial to his parents, established the Frederick Thomas and Madeline Tolksdorf Crimmins Honors Endowed Criminal Justice Scholarship in April 1993. This scholarship is awarded to students majoring in criminal justice or a related field. Mr. Crimmins passed away in 1996, and Mrs. Crimmins passed away in 1999. They have two surviving daughters, Margaret Parham of Stephenville, and Delores Miltenberger of Dallas.

THE HELEN CRIMMINS AND AURELIA TOLKSDORF SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. & Mrs. Carl Crimmins of Stephenville established the Helen Crimmins and Aurelia Tolksdorf Scholarship in 1991 in memory of Mr. Crimmins' sister and aunt. Ms. Aurelia Tolksdorf immigrated to the United States from East Prussia when she was very young and lived with the Crimmins family until her death in 1927. Ms. Helen Crimmins, a native of Fort Worth, was a business major and worked for Sinclair Oil Company until her retirement in 1938. After the death of her husband, Ms. Crimmins moved back to Texas and worked with her sister and brother-in-law who were owners and publishers of the "Texas Beverage News."

Mr. and Mrs. W. Henry Todd of Wichita Falls established five Presidential Honors Scholarships in 1984 honoring their dear friends, family members, and each other. Mr. Todd, a native of Albany, came to Tarleton in 1933. He became a campus leader, participating in several on-campus organizations, and served as captain of the football team. After graduating from the University of Texas, Mr. Todd began working for an oil company and eventually founded his own company, Todd & Sanders, Inc. Mr. Todd was also a major force in the Tarleton Alumni Association and the Tarleton Foundation. Mr. Todd passed away in 1995. Mrs. Todd passed away in April 1997.

THE GUIN LEMKE SCHOLARSHIP

Created through a gift from the estate of Guin Lemke, the scholarship was established in 1995. Mrs. Lemke was a 1939 graduate of John Tarleton Agricultural College and a major supporter of her alma mater. Mrs. Lemke served on the Tarleton Alumni Association Board of Directors for many years.

THE ROY AND MILDRED MCKNIGHT SCHOLARSHIP

The Roy and Mildred McKnight Scholarship was established in 1999 by a gift from the estate of Mildred McKnight of Dublin. Mrs. McKnight passed away in July 1997 at the age of 95. She attended John Tarleton Agricultural College in 1920. She met her husband, Roy McKnight, after attending Baylor University. They married and resided in the Waco area until the late 1960s and returned to the Dublin area after their retirement.

THE AUDREY R. MYERS SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. Mike Myers, Sr. established the Audrey R. Myers Scholarship in 1983 in memory of his mother. Mr. Myers is a native of Olney and a 1956 graduate of Tarleton State University. In 1978, he was honored as a Distinguished Alumnus and served on the first Tarleton State University Development Foundation Board of Directors. Mr. Myers is the CEO of Myers Bancshares, Inc.

THE WILL AND PEARL NIX SCHOLARSHIP

The Will and Pearl Nix Scholarship was established in December 1989 by Mr. & Mrs. W. L. Nix in honor of his parents. A 1951 graduate of Tarleton, Mr. W.L. Nix served as the President of the Tarleton State University Foundation, Inc. Board of Directors and was a member of the Centennial Campaign for the Twenty-first Century Advisory Board. Mr. W. L. Nix passed away in 2013, following the passing of his wife, Barbara Lee Terrell Nix, in 2011.

THE ROBERT AND IRETA PITTMAN SCHOLARSHIP

The Robert and Ireta Cady Pittman Scholarship was established through a bequest from Mrs. Ireta Cady Pittman in 1995. Mrs. Pittman was a 1926 graduate of John Tarleton Agricultural College. Mr. Robert Pittman was born in Desdemona and raised in Alexander. Mr. Pittman began working at a young age as a bank janitor. He graduated from Dublin High School and attended Tarleton while continuing his janitorial duties at the Farmers National Bank in Dublin. He later moved to Stephenville and worked for Stephenville State Bank, now First Financial Bank. From humble beginnings, Mr. Pittman worked his way to Executive Vice President of the Irving State Bank where he retired in 1975. He died in 1986 after a prolonged illness. Robert and Ireta were both widowed when they married in 1969 while living in Irving. The two had known each other for years and attended Tarleton together.

PRESIDENTIAL HONORS SCHOLARSHIP

The Presidential Honors Scholarships are the most prestigious scholarships offered at Tarleton. The Presidential Honors Program is made up of a select group of students chosen as entering freshmen on the basis of demonstrated excellence in academics as well as leadership, service, and a capacity for intellectual inquiry.

HOWARD F. AND WILLIE D. ROSS SCHOLARSHIP

The Howard and Willie D. Ross Scholarship was established through a bequest from Mr. Howard Ross. Mr. and Mrs. Ross were both Tarleton alumni. They lived in Stephenville for many years before retiring and moving to Tyler. Howard, who was 88, and Willie, 81, both died in 1998.

DR. JAMES CLARK TERRELL SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Nix established the Dr. James Clark Terrell Scholarship in 1996. Dr. Terrell was born on August 20, 1899 in Iredell, Texas. He and his young bride, Ellen Wesson Willard moved to Stephenville in 1926. They opened a twelve-bed hospital over a grocery store on East Washington, but built their own building at the corner of Belknap and Tarleton in 1927. Over the next several years the hospital was enlarged. After Dr. Terrell's death in 1980, the hospital was sold to Harris Methodist Health Systems in 1982. Starting a hospital just before the Depression proved a fortunate opportunity. Patients paid for services in produce, needlework, jewelry, oil royalties, or land, much like a banker using them as collateral until the patient had cash to pay the bills. Dr. Terrell's children remember his maxims: "Never spend your principal, only the interest" and "You must have a job. It costs too much to amuse yourself otherwise." It is hoped the recipient of this scholarship will grow in knowledge and experience and become a successful practitioner in his/her chosen field.

THE LOUISE AND TOMMY THOMPSON PRESIDENTIAL HONORS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 2005 by Dr. and Mrs. Barry B. Thompson and Mr. and Mrs. G. Dan Thompson in memory of their parents Louise Baird Thompson and Tommy Thompson. This scholarship is to be awarded to an outstanding student in the Presidential Honors Program at Tarleton State University.

THE TOWN & COUNTRY BANK SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 1994 by Town & Country Bank to assist Presidential Honors students from the Erath County area. Town & Country Bank was an independently owned and operated financial institution serving the citizens of the Cross Timbers area.

THE CLYDE H. WELLS SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. & Mrs. Henry Todd of Wichita Falls established the Clyde H. Wells Scholarship in 1987 in honor of the former Tarleton State University alumnus and longtime Chairman of the Board of Regents for The Texas A&M University System. Mr. Wells was a native of Stephenville and a graduate of Tarleton and Texas A&M University. He was a successful rancher and investor who contributed to the educational and agricultural systems in Texas. He served on the Board of Regents for 24 years, served as Chairman of the Council of Governing Boards of Texas Colleges and Universities, and was a director for the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association, the Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show and the Texas A&M Research Foundation. The Fine Arts Center was dedicated in Mr. Wells' honor in 1980. Mr. Wells died in January 1987. His wife, Mrs. Marie Wells of Granbury passed away in 2009. Their daughter, Lana, and her husband Raye Collier live in Dallas, Texas.

DORA L. WILLARD AND ELLEN W. WILLARD TERRELL SCHOLARSHIP

The Dora L. Willard & Ellen W. Willard Terrell Scholarship was established in 1996 by Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Nix to honor the Willard sisters. Dora Lee Willard and Ellen Willard Terrell were good nurses and good women. They were good citizens and were politically active. They always voted and tried to stay informed. Ellen took courses at Tarleton when her children were in college. Mr. and Mrs. Nix established this scholarship in the hope the recipients of this scholarship will use their education to benefit both themselves and others.

THE ROYCE E. WISENBAKER SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. & Mrs. Royce Wisenbaker of Tyler established the Royce E. Wisenbaker Scholarship in 1984. The scholarship was established for the Presidential Honors Program. Mr. Wisenbaker previously served on The Texas A&M University System Board of Regents. Mr. Wisenbaker passed away September 11, 2001.

Tarleton Academic Scholarships

ACADEMIC CIRCLE SCHOLARSHIP

The Academic Circle is comprised of donors who give unrestricted gifts of less than \$1,000 through the Greater Tarleton Annual Fund, which provides crucial day to day operating support for the university's colleges, programs and departments. Annual gifts from friends and Tarleton alumni help bridge the gap between state support and the true cost of education students.

ACADEMIC CIRCLE GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2013, this scholarship is awarded to graduate students nominated by their college dean and selected by the Dean of the College of Graduate Studies.

MAJOR GENERAL CHRIS ADAMS, JR AIR FORCE ROTC SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Major General Chris S. Adams, Jr, this scholarship is awarded annually to a full time student who is a contracted member of the US Air Force ROTC, an active member of the Texan Corps of Cadets, demonstrates outstanding leadership qualities, and maintains a minimum GPS of 2.75.

DR. ANN ALBRECHT HONORARY COUNSELING ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by Dr. Dennis Jones and Dr. Annette Albrecht, this scholarship is awarded to a student who is in their second year of the Masters in Counseling Program and who has earned a 4.0 GPA in their first semester of the Masters in Counseling Program.

BARBARA JEANNE ADAMS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2007 in memory of Barbara Jeanne Adams. Mrs. Adams' teaching career spanned 40 years, teaching elementary school through high school in addition to teaching music at all levels in Texas and Florida. The scholarship is awarded to a graduate of Motley County I.S.D., Patton Springs I.S.D., or a high school in Dickens County.

AGRICULTURE CAREER DEVELOPMENT ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004, this scholarship is awarded to freshmen who participated and excelled in Tarleton's annual invitational agricultural judging contests as a high school student.

AGRICULTURE CONTEST SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to top ranking high school seniors participating in state level contests, including Dairy Foods, Pasture and Range, Forage Evaluation, and Land Judging.

AGRICULTURAL SERVICES AND DEVELOPMENT ALUMNI ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to students who are active in the Tarleton Collegiate FFA Chapter, and who are majoring in the area of Agricultural Services and Development. The scholarship was established in March 2003 by Dr. David Drueckhammer.

ALLEN CATTLE MANAGEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to students pursuing a degree in Animal Production or related field from Bosque County.

J. BRAD & NANCY GAGE ALLEN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by Brad and Nancy Allen of Stephenville. Brad is a 1974 graduate of Tarleton with a degree in Biology. Nancy graduated in 1976 with a degree in Physical Education and later a degree in Nursing. Mr. & Mrs. Allen established this scholarship to benefit students of Tarleton who have shown academic excellence.

ALPHA GAMMA DELTA EPSILON UPSILON ALUMNAE ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 2015 by Alpha Gamma Delta Alumnae for active members of Alpha Gamma Delta who demonstrates financial need.

ALPHA PHI OMEGA ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2013 by the Xi Omicron Chapter of Alpha Phi Omega Alumni. This scholarship will be awarded to a full time student who demonstrates financial need, is an active member of Xi Omicron Chapter of Alpha Phi Omega and exemplifies the three cardinal principles of Alpha Phi Omega: friendship, leadership, and service.

AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF UNIVERSITY WOMEN ROSELLEN DAVIS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by the American Association of University Women of Stephenville in 2006 and is awarded to a female high school senior from Erath County who plans to attend Tarleton State University as a full time student.

THE GLENDA ANDERSON MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in January 2000 by the friends and family of Dr. Glenda Anderson, who was a devoted and caring faculty member in the Department of Computer Information Systems. She began her employment at Tarleton in 1989. The scholarship is awarded to a student majoring in Computer Information Systems.

THE GUY ANDREWS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in December 2002 by Dr. Sue Cullers. This scholarship is awarded to students pursuing a degree in Agriculture. The students must be a graduate of a 1A or equivalent high school.

THE ARAMARK ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FOR DIETETICS

The ARAMARK Endowed Scholarship was established to assist worthy students pursuing a career in dietetics. ARAMARK was a long time provider of food services at Tarleton State University.

THE DEXTOR & LEROY ATOR SCHOLARSHIP

The Dextor and Leroy Ator Scholarship was established by the children of the Ator family in honor of their parents. All nine children and several of their grandchildren continue the tradition of attending Tarleton State University.

THE JOE W. AUTRY SCHOLARSHIP IN AGRICULTURE

Established in 2000 by his family and friends in honor of 1938 Tarleton graduate, former teacher and Vice President Emeritus, Dr. Joe W. Autry. The scholarship is awarded to a student majoring in Agriculture. Dr. Autry passed away in 2005.

SUE BAKER MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Sue Baker Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of Sue Baker, who died of a brain tumor. Ms. Baker was a women's basketball coach at Tarleton State University. This scholarship is awarded to a physical education major active in women's athletics.

BALFOUR BEATTY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2014 by Balfour Beatty PLC, this scholarship is awarded to students living in Heritage Hall's Living-Learning Community.

CECIL BALLOW MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Cecil Ballow Memorial Endowed Scholarship was established in tribute to Coach Cecil Ballow. Coach Ballow led the Tarleton baseball team to runners-up title in the 1960 Junior College National Tournament, with many of his athletes earning All-American status at senior colleges.

THE CARROLL & LETA BARHAM ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The children of Carroll & Leta Barham established the scholarship in 1985 as a tribute to the Barham's 50th wedding anniversary and as a memorial to their son, Dohn, who died of cancer in 1988.

BEN AND NELLIE BATY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. and Mrs. Ben Baty established this endowed scholarship in 2009 to benefit students majoring in marketing or business management at Tarleton State University. The recipient of the scholarship must have a 3.0 grade-point average, demonstrate strong academic performance, and exhibit leadership qualities such as participating in student activities or part-time employment to financially supplement their education. Priority will be given to U.S. Army ROTC (Reserve Officers' Training Corps) students. This scholarship was endowed through the Tarleton State University Foundation, Inc.

Mr. Baty attended Tarleton from 1948-50 and is a graduate of Texas A&M University: a distinguished military graduate with a degree in marketing. After a tour of duty in the U.S. Army, he joined Shell Oil Company. Following a distinguished 38 year career with Shell, Mr. Baty was appointed executive vice president of Hanna-Sherman International Inc., Portland, Oregon. Mr. Baty is a Distinguished Alumnus and served as President of the Tarleton State University Foundation and the Tarleton State University Alumni Association.

PAUL D. AND GERRY B. BEARDEN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2013 from a gift from the estate of Gerry B. Bearden this scholarship is awarded to a full time student pursuing a bachelor degree.

THE ASHLEY ELIZABETH BEASLEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in February 2002 by Dane and Linda Beasley in memory of their daughter. This scholarship is awarded to students majoring in Interdisciplinary Studies who are planning to teach at the elementary level.

TRUMAN T. BELL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in April 2003 by Truman T. Bell, a 1971 graduate of Tarleton. Mr. Bell has been active with Tarleton alumni activities and served on the Tarleton Foundation Board of Directors. This scholarship is awarded to undergraduate math and/or science majors who plan to teach.

BUDDY BILLS FAMILY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017, this scholarship is awarded annually to a full time undergraduate who is a graduate of a high school in Erath, Comanche, Hamilton, Bosque, Somervell, Hood, Palo Pinto, or Eastland Counties.

THE BIRDSONG ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in August 2002 by Tom and Connie Birdsong, long-time supporters of Tarleton. This scholarship is awarded to incoming freshmen majoring in Hydrology or Agriculture. Mrs. Birdsong passed away in 2011.

DR. MARY ANN BLOCK FAMILY CONSUMER SCIENCES EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in honor of Dr. Mary Ann Block, a long time professor of Human Sciences at Tarleton, serving as Department Head at the time of her retirement. The scholarship is awarded to a junior or senior with a preference to a student majoring in Family Consumer Sciences Teacher Education program.

BOSQUE RIVER WATER ASSOCIATION ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in July of 1997 by the Bosque River Water Association, this scholarship is awarded to students pursuing a degree in Hydrology and Water Resources.

DR. JAMES BOYD MEMORIAL ENDOWMENT

The Dr. James Boyd Memorial Endowment was established by Dr. Jim Boyd in 1989 to promote instructional leadership in public schools of Texas. The scholarship is awarded to a graduate student pursuing a degree in education, a professional certificate, or a professional development experience. Originally named to honor his mother, Sally Boyd, the endowment's name was changed following his death and is to honor his legacy in education.

KACEE BRADLEY TOP HAND MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by the family and friends of Kacee Bradley in 2011 to benefit deserving students participating in Tarleton's Rodeo activities. Kacee enjoyed the simple cowboy way of life and earned an upstanding reputation as a cattleman in Eastern New Mexico. He maintained the family farm in Tucumcari and was employed by Pickett Industries as Ranch Foreman overseeing ranch productions in Tucumcari and Ft. Sumner. Kacee and his wife, Heather, played an active role in volunteering for the Tarleton State University Rodeo Program through community service and fundraising opportunities. Kacee passed away in 2010.

THE BRAGG FAMILY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP; IN HONOR OF JORI BRAGG

Created in 2016 by David W. Bragg and Jamie L. Jones in honor of Jori Bragg. Recipients of this scholarship must be a deserving full time student and have declared a major in Electrical Engineering (first preference) or Industrial Technology (second preference).

GARY WAYNE BRANNON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Gary Wayne Brannon Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a full-time undergraduate student of at least sophomore status, who is an initiated brother of Kappa Delta Rho fraternity. Recipient must have at least one year involvement with Zeta Beta and the local community. The student must also exhibit gentlemanly conduct inside and outside of Tarleton State University.

THE PHILIP & RUTH BRATTEN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1983 by Mrs. Cooper Adams in memory of her parents. The Brattens were natives of Ohio until World War I when they moved to Texas. They bought a ranch in Hood County near Granbury where they spent a great deal of their time. They were very interested in education and because they realized the critical importance of a plentiful supply of water, the scholarship is awarded to a worthy Hydrology major.

THE J.W. & A.E. BRIGHT ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Frances Allen established the J.W. & A.E. Bright Endowed Scholarship in 1971 in memory of her parents.

BG BRINEGAR FAMILY "LEAD THE WAY" ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by George and Christine Brinegar, this scholarship is awarded annually to a undergraduate student who is a sophomore, member of the Corps of Cadets, and is seeking commission in the Armed Forces.

MORTON P. & EDNA BROOKS MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Morton P. and Edna Brooks in December of 2000.

THE ARLIE BROWN MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The friends of Dr. Arlie Brown, established this scholarship in 1989. Dr. Brown became a physician and hospital owner in Freer, Texas. This scholarship was established through the Tarleton State University Foundation, Inc., and is awarded to any senior of a Texas high school.

MICHAEL DOUGLAS BROYLES ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Paul and Susie Fagan, in memory of their son, this scholarship is awarded annually to a full-time student majoring in medical laboratory science.

W.P. & LUCILLE BRUMMETT ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in December of 1996 by Lucille Brummett. This scholarship is awarded to students who graduated from Hico High School.

THE DWAIN & CAROLYN BRUNER ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by the employees of Bruner Motors as a holiday gift to their employer, Mr. Dwain Bruner and his wife, Carolyn. This scholarship is awarded to an entering freshman who is a graduate of an Erath County high school. The student must demonstrate strong leadership skills.

BUSBY QUARTER HORSE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2014 by Busby Quarter Horse LLC, this scholarship is awarded to full time students who are members of the Tarleton Rodeo Team.

MAJOR J.W. BURKETT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1964 by Major Burkett's family. Major Burkett served as a professor at Tarleton from 1959-1962. While serving as a military advisor to the South Vietnamese Army in the summer of July 1964, he was killed in action. This scholarship is awarded to an outstanding military science major.

THE JOHN CARAWAY MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

THE JOHN CARAWAY NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in the will of Mr. John Caraway of Stephenville in 2000 to assist worthy students pursuing degrees in music and nursing. Mr. Caraway retired from Gulf Oil as the Accounting Manager of the Midland offices in 1983. Caraway attended Tarleton and earned his Bachelor's Degree in Management from Texas Tech University. A native of Reagan County, he was drafted into the military during the Korean conflict and sent to Fort Sam Houston to Medical Field Service School. He was discharged in 1952 and went to work for Gulf at the Fort Worth Division Office in 1953. Mr. Caraway passed away in 2000.

SUE CARLSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the family of Sue Carlson in May of 2004. This scholarship is awarded to a full time student majoring in a medical related field from Erath or Bosque Counties. Serious consideration will be given to an applicant who has had cancer, or has had an immediate family member who has had cancer.

THE ARTHUR J. AND BEATRICE ROBINSON CARTER ENDOWED NURSING SCHOLARSHIP.

Established as two separate endowments in 2010 and 2009, respectively by Cynthia Carter in memory of her father and mother, and combined into one endowment in 2012, this scholarship is awarded to a nursing major from the McLennan County area. Arthur Carter was a Waco native, married Beatrice Robinson in November 1966, and had one child, Cynthia Carter, MBA, Ph.D.. Arthur and Beatrice loved serving the church and the community and gave in many ways. Creating this scholarship in their memory pays their generosity forward by assisting deserving students.

DONALD CAWLEY SOCIAL WORK ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Dr. Darla D. Beaty, Social Work Faculty, in memory of her husband Donald, a life-long social worker, this scholarship is awarded to a full time student who has been accepted into the Social Work Program, with preference going to students who attend classed at the Tarleton-Waco Outreach Location. The recipient must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need.

DR. MARIE MEISEL CEDARS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by the friends and family of Dr. Cedars. Dr. Cedars was a member of the faculty at Tarleton for many years as a French instructor and was an accomplished artist. Dr. Cedars' group of twelve paintings based on the book "6 Days of Destruction" by Elie Wiesel, an Auschwitz survivor, and Rabbi Albert H. Friedlander, who fled Germany in 1939, has been displayed in New York galleries and many other major cities across the United States. The collection features images from the Biblical account of creation and Holocaust individual tragedies.

THE JOHN S. CHAPIN YOUNG FARMERS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1976 by Mr. Chapin's wife, Carolyn, and Grace Chapin, as a memorial. It is awarded to students majoring in Agriculture.

CHILDERS FAMILY CRIMINAL JUSTICE LEADERSHIP EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by Mark and Katherine Childers, this scholarship shall be awarded annually to a full time student who is a Criminal Justice major and is involved in leadership experiences through service to others.

THE CHILTON ENDOWMENT IN COMPUTER INFORMATION SYSTEMS

Established in 1990 by the Chilton family. Dr. Stuart Chilton served in many leadership roles while employed at Tarleton from 1954 to 1966 and Dr. Brad Chilton retired from Tarleton in 2012. Stuart Chilton, III is a 2006 graduate of Tarleton. This scholarship is awarded to a deserving student majoring in the Computer Information Systems program.

ROBERTA CLAY SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a student showing the superior ability and performance in campus publications. This scholarship is for the promotion of journalistic ability.

THE MAJOR WILLIAM CLAY, JR. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Created in 1962 by family members of Major Clay. Major Clay's plane was gunned down in 1944 during a bomb raid over Yap Island in the Pacific. This scholarship is awarded to graduates of Stephenville High School.

CLASS OF 2014 AGRIBUSINESS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2015 for members of the Agribusiness Club.

THE CLINICAL LABORATORY SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by Dr. and Mrs. Lamar Johanson. The Johansons have long been supporters of Tarleton and its students. Dr. Johanson served as an educator and in various leadership positions at Tarleton for 40 years before his retirement in the spring of 2001. While serving as Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Dr. Johanson was instrumental in the formation of the Clinical Laboratory Science degree program in Fort Worth.

THE RICHARD DON AND SUZANNE STONE COAN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1995 by Richard and Susie Coan of Stephenville. Mr. Coan served as President of the Tarleton Foundation Board of Directors. The scholarship is awarded to a junior or senior student at Tarleton.

COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE AND HUMAN SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to an outstanding student from the College of Agriculture and Human Sciences at Tarleton State University, now known as the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences.

COLLEGE OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to an outstanding student from the College of Business Administration at Tarleton State University.

COBA/SELECT SIRES, INC. SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 1995 by the COBA/Select Sires, Inc. to assist an undergraduate sophomore, junior or senior level student majoring in Animal Science with an emphasis in Dairy Science.

COBA STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2012, this scholarship is awarded to a student in good academic standing who is registered in a Study Abroad class in the College of Business Administration.

COLFA DEAN'S CIRCLE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by the College of Liberal and Fine Arts. Dean's Circle is a giving society in which supporters give unrestricted funds to meet the needs of the college.

CADEN COLTHARP MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Caden Coltharp Memorial Endowed Scholarship fund was established by John and Kay Coltharp in 2013 in loving memory of their son. Caden was an avid rodeo athlete and excelled in academics. The scholarship will be awarded to rodeo athletes.

THE COMANCHE COUNTY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1998 by Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Nix formerly of Stephenville. The recipient of the scholarship must be a graduate from a high school in Comanche County. Mrs. Nix passed away in 2011. Mr. Nix passed away in 2013.

THE O.C. & ALLENE KNOX COOK SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. & Mrs. O.C. Cook of Dublin created three scholarships for Hico, Evant, and Mozelle high schools in 1986. Both Mr. & Mrs. Cook, alumni of Tarleton (class of '26 and '30 respectively), devoted over 80 years to education. Mr. Cook passed away February 24, 1992. Mrs. Cook passed away October 27, 1994.

DUNCAN WILLS CORBETT SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

Established in 2013 by Duncan Corbett, this scholarship is awarded annually to a full time Tarleton student.

R.E. "DICK" CORLEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Bob and Sue Griffin, in memory of Sue's late husband, this scholarship is awarded annually to a junior or senior majoring in Wildlife, Sustainability, and Ecosystem Sciences who is maintaining a minimum GPA of 2.0.

THE BOB & ZETA WALL CREWS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP IN ANIMAL SCIENCES

Established in October 1993 by Mr. J.R. Birdwell and family. Recipients of this scholarship must be majoring in a program within the Department of Animal Sciences, and be a full-time undergraduate student at Tarleton State University.

CROSS PLAINS GARDEN CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by the Cross Plains Garden Club, this scholarship will be awarded annually to a full-time student from Cross Plains High School.

THE CROSS TIMBERS SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 by member schools of the Cross Timbers School Development Council (CTSDC) to provide assistance to incoming freshmen who graduate from one of the area CTSDC schools. The Council serves as a forum for school administrators to meet and share ideas and services. The CTSDC is designed to meet the needs of its member schools and has been serving schools across the region for over 20 years.

CRYSTAL APPLE SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP

The College of Education at Tarleton State University has established a new award to honor educators who have made a positive impact on the lives of students. This scholarship will be given to doctoral, graduate, or undergraduate students in the College of Education that are in good standing in the academic program and recommended by the respective Department Head. Recipients must maintain a 3.0 GPA.

JOE E. CUDE ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Joe E. and Patricia H. Cude, this scholarship will be awarded annually to full time students who are majoring in Engineering and have a minimum GPA of 3.5. Joe W. Cude served as Head of the Department of Mathematics and Physics from 1972 through 1990 when he resigned that position. He continued to teach in the Department as Professor of Mathematics until his retirement in 2001.

PATRICIA CUDE CIS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Patricia Cude CIS Endowed Scholarship Fund was created in 2012 to honor Mrs. Cude for her many years teaching CIS at Tarleton State University. Dr. and Mrs. Cude wanted to be able to assist those students who have a financial need and to encourage students to seek a major in Computer Information Systems.

MARION CUMMINGS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to graduate students working towards a teaching degree for service in public schools. The recipient is selected by the Stephenville Classroom Teachers Association.

THE PAUL & OPAL CUNYUS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in December 1995 by Mr. Paul Cunyus and family. The scholarship was established to benefit a deserving Tarleton student in the field of fine arts, education, elementary education, or horticulture. Mr. Cunyus came to Tarleton in the early 1920s from his home in East Texas. He completed two years at John Tarleton Agricultural College, majoring in Agriculture. Upon graduation, he transferred to Texas A&M where he received his bachelor's and master's degrees. After World War II, he returned to Tarleton as the Associate Dean and served in that capacity for 25 years. He retired in the early 1970s. Mr. Cunyus passed away in 1996. His wife, Opal, preceded him in death.

DR. SAMUEL E. CURL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by Jane Curl Parker and Julia Curl, this scholarship was established in memory of their father, Dr. Samuel E. Curl. This scholarship is awarded annually to a full time student who is in good standing and is majoring in the agricultural field.

DAIRY PRODUCTS INSTITUTE OF TEXAS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by Dairy Products Institute, this scholarship is awarded annually to a full time student in the College of Agricultural and Environmental Science demonstrating an interest in dairy production, dairy business, or dairy foods.

THE C.J. "RED" DAVIDSON SCHOLARSHIP

DAVIDSON PRESIDENTIAL ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

Established in the late 1960s by Mr. Davidson. He gave a large amount of property to be invested in order to serve the needs of Tarleton. The scholarships are divided into the C.J. "Red" Davidson Scholarship and the Davidson Presidential Scholarship.

THE J. THOMAS DAVIS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1945 by Mrs. Seleta Dennis as a tribute to J. Thomas Davis. Dean Davis served as the Dean of John Tarleton Agricultural College for twenty-six years.

THE UTA DAVIS CAMPUS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Various donors created the Uta Davis Scholarship as a memorial scholarship. Mrs. Davis was the wife of J. Thomas Davis, who served as Dean of John Tarleton Agricultural College for twenty-six years.

C.H. DAWSON AND E. A. "DOC" BLANCHARD SCHOLARSHIP FUND IN INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGY

Established in 1987 as a memorial to C.H. Dawson and E. A. "Doc" Blanchard, who both served as faculty members, the scholarship is awarded to students majoring in Industrial Technology and Education.

DELEON, TX EX-STUDENTS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Established in October 1994 by Mr. John Caraway of Stephenville to benefit deserving students from DeLeon, Texas.

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2013 by the Tarleton Alumni Association Distinguished Alumni Chapter with the intent to help develop future leaders. This scholarship is awarded annually to a full time student in good standing who has earned a minimum of 60 semester credit hours and maintains a minimum of 12 semester credit hours.

THE JOSEPHINE GARRETT DONALDSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by the family of Mrs. Josephine Donaldson to honor her lifetime dedication to her family and friends. Mrs. Donaldson attended Tarleton from 1943 to 1945 majoring in Home Economics. The scholarship is awarded to a Human Sciences major.

THE EDWIN D. & WELBA C. DORSEY ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 by Dr. and Mrs. Edwin D. Dorsey of Belton. Both Dorsey's are alumni of Tarleton. Dr. Dorsey was honored during the 1997 Alumni Academic Forum. Dr. Dorsey was one of the first students to receive a Bachelor of Science in chemistry in 1964. He retired as Vice President of Research and Development Analytical Chemistry at Alcon Laboratories in Fort Worth. The scholarship is awarded to a full time junior or senior chemistry major.

DOSS FOUNDATION TEXAS BANK SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship will be given to a deserving, full-time, junior or senior level student from Brown, Comanche or Erath County with financial need.

THE M.S. & LANE DOSS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This endowment was established in 2003 by The M.S. Doss Foundation, Inc. The scholarship is awarded to full time undergraduate students from high schools in western Texas.

BOB AND DARLA DOTY RODEO SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Bob and Darla Doty, this scholarship benefits students who are eligible to compete for Tarleton State University in National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association rodeos.

THE LINDA DUNCAN HONORARY COUNSELING SCHOLARSHIP

Originally established through the Cross Timbers Counseling Association in 1992, the Linda Duncan Honorary Counseling Scholarship was established at Tarleton State University in the spring of 2014 by Dr. Annette Albrecht and Dr. Dennis Jones, in honor of Dr. Linda Duncan's retirement from Tarleton. This scholarship is to honor the extraordinary career of Dr. Linda Duncan. Dr. Duncan has set an example to others through her various roles as counselor, educator, practitioner, advisor and colleague. The scholarship shall be awarded to a student who has completed 24 semester hours of counseling related courses at Tarleton. Recipients must have full admittance to the Counseling Program and have a graduate grade point average of 3.5. The scholarship will be awarded annually through the Counseling Program at Tarleton.

THE EDWARD AND RUBY BOWND'S DUSEK SCHOLARSHIP

Established in September of 1999 by Gaye Lynn Seawright and family. This scholarship is awarded to junior, senior or graduate students pursuing a degree in Business.

THE WILLIAM EDWIN DYESS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1975 as a memorial to Colonel Dyess, who was killed in a plane crash in 1944. This scholarship also honors all former Tarleton students who have served in the armed forces.

THE BETTY KNUDSON EDGAR MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2011 by Arlen Edgar in memory of his wife Betty Knudson Edgar. Betty Knudson was born in Waco, Texas in September 1935. Most of her early childhood was spent in Friendswood, Texas. She graduated from Amon Carter Riverside High School in Fort Worth, Texas. In high school, she became the Texas State Baton Twirling Champion. In 1953 and 1954, she attended Tarleton – then known as Tarleton State College. While there she met a student, Arlen Edgar, who later became her husband. She received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Baylor University in 1956 with a major in Biology and a minor in Chemistry. At Baylor, she was a twirler in the Golden Wave Band. Following study at Brackenridge Hospital School of Medical Technology in Austin, Texas, she received a certificate as a Registered Medical Technologist.

Following her marriage to Arlen Edgar in November 1957, she resided briefly in Odessa, Texas; Brisbane, Australia and for many years Midland, Texas. Before retiring to raise a family, she worked in the medical laboratories in Midland. She was extremely active as a volunteer in Midland civic, cultural and church organizations involved in the arts, history, education genealogy and religion. Betty Knudson Edgar passed away in December 2010.

This endowment is established to provide financial aid to Tarleton students pursuing a degree in Biology and/ or in a field related to medicine.

THE ZEDDIE & RUBY EDGAR MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1993 by the Edgar family in memory of Mr. Edgar, who passed away in June 1993 at the age of 87. In his 43-year career at Tarleton, Mr. Edgar taught thousands of students in a wide variety of business courses. This scholarship was established by the faculty of the Department of Education and Psychology in memory of Robert Elliott in 1990. This scholarship is awarded to a student in the Teacher Education Program.

ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY FOUNDERS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a full time student enrolled in the Engineering Technology program.

THE ERATH COUNTY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 by Mr. and Mrs. W.L. Nix formerly of Stephenville. The recipient of the scholarship must be a graduate from a high school in Erath County. Mrs. Nix passed away in 2011. Mr. Nix passed away in 2013.

THE ERATH COUNTY ASSOCIATION OF RETIRED SCHOOL EMPLOYEES ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP This scholarship was established in 1980 by the Erath County Retired Teachers Association (now known as the Erath County Association of Retired School Employees). It is awarded to students from Erath County who are pursuing a future as a teacher.

THE EVANS FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

This scholarship was established in 2012 by Chad and Jessica Evans, both Tarleton graduates and Tarleton employees. The Evans' desire to honor their extended families, who are also Tarleton graduates, led them to establish this endowment to assist other Tarleton students who demonstrate financial need to complete their degree.

THE EVANS-HAWES SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Dr. Raeford Evans and Mr. Doug Hawes. Dr. Evans served as Department Head of Agronomy, Horticulture, and Agricultural Economics. Mr. Hawes attended Tarleton in 1978. The scholarship is the result of the proceeds from the Freshman Agronomy Lab Manual sales. The scholarship is awarded to an outstanding agricultural student.

KENNETH EVATT RODEO SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 2013 by Howard Evatt. It is awarded to one full time male rodeo student and one full time female rodeo student.

FACULTY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FOR BUSINESS STUDENTS

Established in 2017 by Dr. Dennis Jones and Dr. Annette Albrecht, this scholarship is awarded to a full time student who is pursuing a major in the College of Business Administration.

MINNIE HANCOCK FAGAN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

This scholarship was established in 2010 by Joe and Lura Fagan. It is awarded to a student majoring in Elementary Education.

ROBERT C. AND PATRICIA A. FAIN MATH AND CHEMISTRY TEACHING ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in honor of Patricia A. (Pat) Fain who devoted her entire professional life to teaching mathematics in the public schools. THE JOHN & LILLIE MAY FARLEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in December 1989 by Mr. & Mrs. Farley of Proctor. Mr. Farley, a native of Kiowa, Oklahoma, attended John Tarleton College and Texas A&M in 1931 and 1932. He was employed as a telegraph operator for Exxon Pipe Line in 1933. He worked in various positions until his retirement as a Mechanical Supervisor on July 8, 1977. Mrs. Farley, a native of Proctor, Texas, attended John Tarleton College when it was a two-year institution. She graduated with an Associate degree in 1931. She later received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education (Cum Laude) from the University of Texas in Austin in 1956. She taught elementary education for over 24 years. Mr. Farley passed away in December 1996 and Mrs. Farley passed away in 2007.

DAN AND GENEVA FENDER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Callie Fender, in memory of her grandparents, Dan and Geneva Fender, this scholarship will be awarded to a student who previously lived under the care of the Sherwood and Myrtie Foster's Home for Children.

THE FRANCES FENNER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1982 by Leonard Fenner of Stephenville in memory of his wife. Mrs. Fenner had attended Tarleton State University for a brief time, majoring in business.

THE WINNIE MCANELLY FIEDLER MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Mrs. Zora Fiedler in 1993 in memory of her sister. The scholarship is awarded to an outstanding academically deserving student majoring in History. Mrs. Zora Fiedler passed away in 1999.

Established in 2017 by the First National Bank of Granbury of Hood County, Texas, this scholarship is awarded to a student from Hood, Parker, Somervell, or Johnson Counties who is majoring in an area of business.

JERRY FLEMMONS JOURNALISM SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1984 by the Tarleton Alumni Association as a tribute to Mr. Jerry Flemmons, the Drama Scholarship is awarded to a student in good academic standing interested in drama at Tarleton. The Jerry Flemmons Journalism Scholarship is awarded to a communications major.

Mr. Flemmons was born in Stephenville. He attended Tarleton and was a small college All-American quarterback. Mr. Flemmons joined the staff of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram in 1963. He was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize for his coverage of the Wichita Falls tornado in 1979. He was a contributing editor to Southern Living magazine and authored several books. He retired in 1979 as the travel editor at the Star-Telegram. He received a Distinguished Alumni Award from the Tarleton Alumni Association in 1983. He was the writer-in-residence at Tarleton at the time of his death.

MARY FLETCHER ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1979 by Randy Fletcher as a memorial to his aunt who was a professor at Tarleton. It is awarded to students who are planning to teach in public schools.

THE C.M. "DUTCH" FLORY SCHOLARSHIP

The C.M. "Dutch" Flory Scholarship was established as a memorial to Dr. Flory from his children. He was a coach and taught physical education at Tarleton State University. The scholarship is awarded to a physical education major.

AUDIE & ZERA FLOYD EDUCATIONAL TRUST SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006 by the Audie and Zera Floyd Educational Trust for the students and employees of the DeLeon Public Schools at Tarleton State University. This scholarship was established upon the death of the Floyds' daughter, Anna Faye Floyd Crockett. The Floyd's had lived a frugal life in Comanche County so that, upon their deaths, the remainder of their estate would be used to create an educational trust fund for economically disadvantaged students. Scholarships are also available to current employees of the De Leon Independent School District under the same admission requirements.

FOLLETT BOOK STORE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship will be given to deserving students. Recipients must have a 3.00 overall GPA and maintain and complete full-time student status. Incoming freshmen must have an SAT total (math and verbal) of at least 1000 or an ACT Composite of 23 or higher with top quarter ranking in their high school class.

MARY ANNE FOREMAN SCHOLARSHIP

A graduate of Stephenville High School, Mary Anne Foreman attended Tarleton before earning her bachelor's in journalism from Southwest Texas State and her master's, also in journalism, from the University of North Texas. She served as the sports editor for the Stephenville Empire-Tribune before going to work at Tarleton in the university news department in 1983. As a communications specialist, Foreman was responsible for keeping Tarleton's name before the public, writing press releases about different events and goings-on at the university. In 1999, Foreman was honored for her many hours of writing and photography by being named as Tarleton's Employee of the Month for March. After serving Tarleton for more than 23 years, Foreman passed away in 2006. This scholarship was established by the friends and family of Mary Anne in her memory. The recipient shall be a full-time student majoring in Communications with Journalism as a support area and have demonstrated an interest in photography and/or sports writing.

THE FLORA FOUST GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1982 by Mrs. Foust, who passed away in 1984. The scholarship honors a graduate student who excels academically in the classroom.

THE FLORENCE PEEK FOUST MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship benefits those non-traditional students who demonstrate financial need.

THE JAMES & ERMA FOUST ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in January 2003 from the estate of Mr. and Mrs. James "Mack" Foust. The scholarship benefits deserving students of academic excellence in mathematics, engineering, or the natural sciences. Mr. Foust was a long-time University employee during the 1970s and held the position of University Engineer.

THE BOBBY FOX MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1987 as a memorial to Coach Fox. Coach Fox was a former coach and athletic director at Tarleton. The scholarship is awarded to a Tarleton athlete demonstrating outstanding leadership and athletic abilities.

JOHN FRANKS MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 in memory of John Franks, a graduate of Tarleton State University. This scholarship is awarded to a full-time student majoring in agriculture and who is an active member of the Tarleton Rodeo Team.

OSCAR FRAZIER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1965 by Mr. John D. Watkins of Luling, Texas, a close personal friend of Oscar Frazier, upon his retirement from Tarleton State University. Mr. Frazier came to Tarleton in 1924 as an instructor in the Agriculture Department and college track coach. He quickly became an outstanding faculty member, becoming full professor in 1935 and the head of the Department of Agricultural Engineering and Animal Husbandry in 1940. After serving in the armed forces for four years, he returned to Tarleton as a professor in the Mathematics Department and track coach. Of all his accomplishments, Frazier is perhaps best remembered for his achievements as Tarleton's track coach. Between 1925 and 1961, Frazier's track team won nineteen conference championships. The Tarleton Alumni Association selected Frazier as "Distinguished Faculty Member" in 1975. He passed away the next year. On August 25, 1977 Tarleton renamed the track at Memorial Stadium the "Oscar H. Frazier Memorial Track" to honor his immense contributions.

HAROLD AND BETTY FREEMAN SCHOLARSHIP

The Harold and Betty Freeman Scholarship was established in 2004 from a gift from the estate of Mrs. Betty J. Freeman. Both graduates of Tarleton, Harold was a member of the Tarleton class of 1948, and Betty a member of the class of 1949. This scholarship is awarded to a full time student majoring in Education.

FRIENDS OF THE DICK SMITH LIBRARY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Created in 2016 by the Friends of the Dick Smith Library, this scholarship is awarded to a recipient who is currently employed at the Dick Smith Library in good standing, has worked 2 long semesters at the library prior to submitting the scholarship application, be in good standing with the university, and be enrolled in a minimum of 9 semester credit hours.

THE REUBEN FRIOU MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by Mrs. Olene Friou and family in January of 2005. This scholarship is awarded to a full time student pursuing a degree in Business.

THE CHARLES W. & LUCILLE FROH SCHOLARSHIP

The Charles W. and Lucille Froh Scholarship was established in a will by the Frohs in 1969. Mr. Froh taught at Tarleton from 1917 to 1946. This scholarship is awarded to students who are studying piano.

THE BIRDIE HARTSOUGH FREY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established by a gift in June of 2004 from the Birdie Hartsough Frey Trust of Fort Worth, Texas. The Birdie Hartsough Frey Memorial Scholarships are awarded to outstanding students pursuing a degree from Tarleton State University.

DR. H. BEDFORD FURR AND DR. ONETA R. FURR SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. H. Bedford Furr attended John Tarleton Agricultural College and, while on campus, served as student commander of the cadets. Dr. H. Bedford Furr and his wife, Dr. Oneta Furr, established this scholarship because they believe in higher education and know that a college education can change the course of a life in a very positive way. Over the years, the Furrs have helped many achieve dreams of obtaining a college degree. Through their efforts, encouragement, and generosity, the Furrs have created a lasting legacy of service and goodwill to others. Dr. Bedford Furr passed away in May 2011. Dr. Oneta Furr passed away in January 2015.

THE EMMA MAE GARRETT & EVELYN ANDREWS GARRETT HUMAN SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

Established by family members in 1985 as a memorial tribute to their mother, wife, and sister-in-law. It was established for deserving Junior and Senior Human Science majors who live in Erath and surrounding counties, and are full time students. Jo Garrett Donaldson attended Tarleton '43-45; Mary Garrett Lindley in '46-'48; Evelyn Andrews Garrett in '50-'52; all majoring in Home Economics. John B. Garrett attended '46-'48. And the granddaughters of Emma M. Garrett have also attended Tarleton.

BAILEY GASCH SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 2014 by Sherry Gasch. It is awarded to a full time student studying Animal Production.

THE DRUCILLA EBERHART GEORGE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1990 by Mr. Walter George of Coleman, Texas in memory of his wife. Mrs. George attended John Tarleton College and graduated with honors. In 1935, she earned her Bachelor's degree from the University of Texas in Austin. She went on to earn a Master's degree from the University of Texas in 1946, and later fulfilled all requirements for certification as an educational counselor.

GENERAL STUDIES UPWARD BOUND SCHOLARSHIP

The Division of General Studies at Tarleton State University established this scholarship in 2009. Staff members from the Division of General Studies combined their contributions to the Faculty Staff Campaign to create this scholarship. It is awarded to an Upward Bound student.

WALTER AND SARA GEORGE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Walter and Sara George Scholarship was established in 2005 by the George Family. The scholarship is designated for a graduating senior of a Coleman County High School demonstrating financial need. The student should have a declared major in Education with a goal to pursue a career in teaching.

GIFFORD FAMILY VETERANS SCHHOLARSHIP

In honor of the Gifford Family's long history of service to the United States military and in appreciation of all those who serve this scholarship is awarded to any student who has served "Active Duty" service in any branch of the United States military with an honorable or medical discharge.

MORRIS AND BEVERLY GIFFORD ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 2010 by Chris Gifford to honor the countless contributions of his grandparents. Morris and Beverly Gifford endowed the scholarship in 2011. The scholarship is awarded to athletes who graduated high school in Erath, Comanche, Eastland, or Hamilton counties. Mr. Morris Gifford passed away in 2012. Mrs. Gifford continues to reside in Stephenville.

COACH RONNIE GILES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Rodney Payne, this scholarship is awarded annually to a sophomore, junior, or senior student-athlete who is an active offensive lineman on the football team and who is enrolled in summer sessions at Tarleton.

TRUBY GLASSCOCK ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by his daughter, Mrs. Anne Meacham. Mr. Glasscock was born in 1902 in Bell County. He began farming at the age of 16. He lived and farmed southeast of Troy from 1928 to 1968. In the early 1940's, Glasscock helped organize the Bell County Jersey Cattle Club. He also served as President and Director of the Bell County Farm Bureau. In 1957, he was named Top Farmer of the Year by the Central Texas Soil Conservation District. He was a conservationist, farmer, rancher, and dairyman in Bell County for most of his life. Mr. Glasscock passed away in 1988 at the age of 85. The scholarship is awarded to a student who is a graduate of Troy High School.

THE GOLDEN FAMILY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Golden Family Endowed Scholarship is awarded annually to upper-classmen based on high academic achievement and outstanding leadership and participation in campus activities. The scholarship was established in 2003 by Jerry and Sharman Denny Golden ('68/'66) and Josh Golden ('98) and is supported by other family members attending Tarleton during the past half-century. Jerry Golden is a 2011 Distinguished Alumnus, past president of the Tarleton Alumni Association and former member of the Tarleton Foundation. While at Tarleton, Josh was a student body president and chair of the Chancellor's Student Advisory Board of The Texas A&M University System. Jerry's sister, Nancy Golden Turley ('79), is the first woman elected student body president at Tarleton. She is also a past president of the Tarleton Alumni Association and is a 1995 Outstanding Young Alumnae.

ELEANOR GOLDING MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 by Robert and Carol Golding in memory of Eleanor Golding, this scholarship is awarded to a full time student and female athlete in good standing with the University.

THE GOODLETT-HENSARLING ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 1974 by W.S. Goodlett, Jr. to honor former Tarleton agriculture professor, T.A. Hensarling. Scholarships are awarded to students in agriculture. The Goodlett family changed the name from the Hensarling scholarship in 1984 to the Goodlett-Hensarling scholarship in order to honor both men.

THE CORA ROHNE GOODMAN & KING'S DAUGHTERS NURSING ALUMNAE ASSOCIATION MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2000 by Dr. and Mrs. Rueben Walter recognizing Mrs. Goodman's 41-year career in nursing and the hundreds of professional nurses trained at the King's Daughters facility. The scholarship is awarded to students seeking the Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing. Cora Rohne Goodman received her nurses' training at King's Daughters and over the years served as office nurse, private duty nurse, a floor nurse, floor supervisor, and director of nursing services. Born in Bosque County in 1916, Mrs. Goodman graduated with the King's Daughters Class of 1937. Throughout her career, Mrs. Goodman put the patients first and believed that everyone deserved the best healthcare possible. After her retirement from King's Daughters Hospital, she continued as a nursing home consultant for eight years. She passed away in January 2000 at the age of 83.

NURSING ALUMNAE ASSOCIATION MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2000 by Dr. and Mrs. Rueben Walter recognizing Mrs. Goodman's 41-year career in nursing and the hundreds of professional nurses trained at the King's Daughters facility. The scholarship is awarded to students seeking the Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing. THE MR. AND MRS. W.K. GORDON, JR. ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2012 from a generous donation from Mrs. W.K. Gordon, Jr. and the W.K. Gordon, Jr. Foundation. Mrs. Gordon also established the W.K. Gordon Center for the Industrial History of Texas, a Tarleton facility that combines historical research, a museum and special collections library. The center, on Interstate 20 in the ghost town of Thurber, is named after Mrs. Gordon's father-in-law, William Knox Gordon, an engineer, businessman and central figure in Thurber's history.

W.K. Gordon Jr. was born in 1910 and raised in Thurber. He later went on to a successful career as an oil and gas producer, rancher, businessman, and Fort Worth civic leader. In 1934 he married Anna Melissa Hogsett. Her family had deep roots in Fort Worth and Tarrant County. Since his death in 1996, Mrs. Gordon and the Gordon Foundation funded numerous philanthropic causes in North Texas. Historical preservation and history are among her deepest interests. Mrs. Gordon passed away in 2014.

THE JERRY W. AND JEAN GRAHAM ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established upon Mr. Graham's retirement in 2012, the university's division of Finance and Administration and friends of Jerry and Jean Graham established this endowment to honor the vice president and his 42 years of service. Serving the university in various capacities since 1970, Mr. Graham held positions under university presidents William O. Trogdon, Barry B. Thompson, Dennis P. McCabe and F. Dominic Dottavio. This scholarship is awarded to students majoring in degree programs within the College of Business Administration in good standing with the university.

GRANBURY WINE WALK FINE ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2015 by the Granbury Wine Walk, this scholarship is awarded to a full time student who is a Fine Arts major and resides in Hood County.

QUITA GRIFFIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Bob and Sue Griffin, in memory of Bob's late wife, this scholarship is awarded annually to a junior or senior majoring in accounting who is maintaining a minimum GPA of 2.0.

DR. CHRISTOPHER GUTHRIE HISTORY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Created in 2016 by Dr. Teresa Davidian, this scholarship is awarded annually to a recipient who is a full time undergraduate or graduate student majoring in history at Tarleton State University.

THE O.A. GRANT SCHOLARSHIP IN HISTORY/GOVERNMENT

Established in 1989 by Burnaby Munson ('52) to honor Dr. O.A. Grant, a longtime faculty member in the Department of Social Sciences. The scholarship is awarded to a deserving student majoring in History/Government. Dr. Grant passed away in 2004 at the age of 86.

GREATER TEXAS FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Established in August 2005 to assist students seeking degrees at Tarleton State University. The Greater Texas Foundation supports education by increasing access for all Texans and improving educational quality.

THE CHARLES H. HALE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1969 by the Tarleton State College Ex-Students Association. It was established as a memorial to Dr. Hale, who was a faculty member at Tarleton State College. This scholarship is awarded to students majoring in education and seeking certification in secondary education.

THE GLADYS HALE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 by Mrs. Hale's daughters in their mother's memory. The scholarship is awarded to a Human Sciences major.

TARLETON STATE UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION BOB HALLMARK GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Some time ago, the Tarleton State University Foundation, Inc. received an unrestricted gift from Mr. Bob Hallmark, creating the Hallmark Quasi-Endowment. Knowing that in the past graduate students had limited opportunity to compete for scholarships, the Foundation Board met in 2013 and made the decision to utilize the gift from Mr. Hallmark for much needed graduate scholarships, establishing the Bob Hallmark Graduate Scholarship. It is the intent of the Foundation Board that at least one scholarship will be provided per college each year.

BOB AND VERA HALLMARK GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2013, this scholarship is awarded to graduate students nominated by their college dean and selected by the Dean of the College of Graduate Studies.

ROCKY & TRACEY HARDIN SCHOLARSHIP

Rocky and Tracey Hardin of Georgetown, Texas established this scholarship in 2008 to assist students from DeLeon or Georgetown. Both Rocky and Tracey are graduates of Tarleton State University.

HARRIS METHODIST-ERATH COUNTY SPORTS MEDICINE SCHOLARSHIP

On March 1, 1990, the Harris Methodist-Erath County Sports Medicine Scholarship was established through the Tarleton State University Foundation, Inc. as a charitable gift. Mr. George McGowan, Hospital Administrator for Harris Methodist-Erath County Hospital, established the scholarship. The scholarship is awarded to students majoring in sports medicine.

RACHEL HARRIST MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in memory of Rachel Harrist by her mother Diane Taylor in October of 2007. This scholarship is awarded to students seeking a degree with a teaching certification in Science.

H. H. HASSLER MEMORIAL EQUINE SCHOLARSHIP

H.H. Hassler, Jr. was a great lover of horses. Growing up in Stephenville, he lived during a time when horses were the only mode of transportation. Upon graduating from Tarleton, he devoted his time to public education for over 30 years. He was a strong supporter of the development of the equine program when it began at Tarleton. Prior to his death, he periodically served as a guest lecturer for several of the horse production classes. His family and friends established this memorial scholarship in June 1989.

WILLENE LOWERY HENDRICK NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. George Hendrick established the Willene Lowery Hendrick Nursing Scholarship in memory of his wife Willene in 2011. Willene Lowery completed a three-year nursing program in 1950 at Baptist Hospital on the campus of the Wake Forest University medical school in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. After becoming a Registered Nurse, she worked in hospitals in North Carolina and Texas. In 1955, she married Dr. George Hendrick, a professor of English. Willene completed the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing in Public Health at the University of Colorado at Boulder in 1957. After a few years as a clinic nurse at a university Student Health Center, she began work at Planned Parenthood, where she combined her skills as a hospital and clinic nurse with the perspectives of a public health professional. She retired from Planned Parenthood after 38 years as a nurse and then began a second career as an independent scholar. Mrs. Hendrick passed away in 2010. This scholarship is to assist students seeking a BSN in Nursing.

THE DR. E.R. & SAMMYE HENNINGSEN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1990 by Mrs. Sammye Henningsen of Stephenville in honor of her husband, E.R. Mr. Henningsen was a professor in Geology at Tarleton from 1957 – 1988. Mrs. Henningsen passed away in 1999, and Mr. Henningsen passed away in January 2011. The scholarship is awarded to a student majoring in Geology or Earth Science.

THE DANIEL PARKER HERD MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by the Abell-Hanger Foundation, Inc. of Midland, Texas. Daniel was born on February 3, 1976, the third child and second son of Tevis and Patty Herd. He was full of life and brought joy and laughter to his family and friends. He participated in High School Rodeo and graduated from Midland High School in 1995. He was a team roper and attended Tarleton beginning in September 1995, where he was on the Rodeo Team. Daniel died October 30, 1999. Two of his friends from Tarleton told his parents that Daniel was the most kind and generous person that they had ever known and that he brought out the best in others. Daniel's favorite scripture is Psalm 118:24 "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it." Daniel lived his life that way. May all who enjoy the benefit of his scholarship fund remember him and do the same.

THE LONNIE & CLARA HERRING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1976 as a memorial to Lonnie and Clara Herring, who attended Tarleton from 1908 to 1910. This scholarship was established to assist outstanding Texas residents.

THE GLORIA MARTIN HEWLETT SCHOLARSHIP

Attending Tarleton has been a family tradition since 1927. Gloria Hewlett, of Dallas, Texas and a graduate of Tarleton, established this scholarship in 2004 to benefit students originating from Bosque County, where she was raised. Dr. Hewlett has done extensive research on World War II Veterans from Bosque County and has published "Bosque County Armed Forces Veterans" Volume I.

LEE WAYNE WHEELER SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 2013 by Ted and Julia Wheeler as a memorial to their son, Lee Wayne Wheeler. This scholarship is awarded to deserving full time students who demonstrate financial need majoring in Agriculture with first preference given to a student who hasn't received scholarship funds in that year.

THE JOHN FIELDING HIGGS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The John Fielding Higgs Scholarship was created through a bequest in the will of Anne Waldo Atkins (Class of 1919) in January 1963. John Fielding Higgs, a graduate of Stephenville High School and Tarleton College, died in 1947. He was a student at the University of Texas when he enlisted in the Air Force. He became a bomber pilot and was killed on a mission over Germany. His father, Mr. Rufus Fielding Higgs, was the creator and owner of the Stephenville Empire-Tribune.

BEN HOGAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Ben Hogan Foundation Scholarship was established to provide educational opportunities for our youth. Although Mr. Hogan did not have the opportunity to pursue his education due to economic misfortunes, he always realized the importance of a formal education and the positive impact that it has on a young person's life. It is in this spirit that the Ben Hogan Foundation is pleased to provide educational opportunities for young adults wishing to obtain a college education.

HOHENBERGER AGRICULTURAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a student studying in the field of agriculture with first preference being given to a student from Marble Falls, Burnet County, or Blanco County.

IDA LOU NELSON HOLMES ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN HUMAN SCIENCES

Established in 1983 by her niece, Mrs. Margaret W. Graves of Fort Worth. Ms. Holmes taught at John Tarleton College in the 1930s before going to Washington, D.C. to teach in the public schools. She devoted her life to education, and home economics, and was instrumental in adopting the Future Homemakers of America program and other educational tools such as home projects and parent-teacher liaisons.

THE MANDY HOLMES MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 by the friends and family of Mandy Holmes, who was a student at Tarleton when she passed away. Life-long resident of Brown County, Miss Holmes was a 2000 graduate of Bangs High School and a junior Interdisciplinary Studies major. The scholarship is awarded to a student who is a graduate of Bangs High School or May High School.

HONORS DEGREE SCHOLARSHIP

Incoming freshmen recipients must present SAT scores of 1100 or higher (math and verbal) or ACT scores of 24 or higher or top quarter ranking in their graduating class. Returning students must possess a 3.2 or higher overall Tarleton GPA. Recipients must make a commitment to completing the 18-hour Honors Degree Program. Returning students must have significant participation in honors courses during their first year at Tarleton State University.

LEVETA HORD ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship will be awarded to a full time student pursuing a degree in nursing.

HOSEY-WHITMAN ENDOWED MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Created in 2016 by the estate of Abner Benjamin Hosey, this scholarship shall be awarded annually to a full time student involved in FFA and graduating from high school in the top 25% of his/her class from the Lamar Consolidated ISD.

THE HOUSTON LIVESTOCK SHOW & RODEO AGRICULTURAL SCHOLARSHIP

Created in 1991 between Tarleton State University and Mr. Thomas A. Quarles, Assistant General Manager of the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo, in appreciation of Tarleton's commitment and dedication to the development of agricultural education in the State.

THE E.J. HOWELL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by the family of Dr. Eugene Jody Howell to honor his many years of service to Tarleton State University. Dr. Howell served as President of the University from 1945 to 1966. The scholarship is awarded to deserving students pursuing a degree from Tarleton State University.

THE BRIAN K. ILEY ENDOWED MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established as a memorial in 2006 by the friends and family of Brian Iley. Brian was a student of Nursing at Tarleton State University when he passed away in 2005. Brian was very involved with the Boy Scouts of America and earned the rank of Eagle Scout in 2002. The scholarship is awarded to a full time student majoring in a medically related field. Preference is given to those students demonstrating leadership through school activities and community service. Preference is also given to those students who indicate they have achieved the Eagle Scout Award through the Boy Scouts of America or the Gold Award through the Girl Scouts of the USA.

HERBERT JARRETT SOCIAL WORK SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship, named for former Tarleton professor Herbert Jarrett, is awarded to a full-time student accepted into the Social Work Program with a GPA of 3.0 or higher and junior or senior classification.

THE JC PENNEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 by the JCPenney Company of Dallas, Texas. The scholarship is awarded to an upper-level, full-time student pursuing a degree in Information Systems at Tarleton.

THE LTC SAM E. JEFFERS ROTC SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. B.D. O'Neal established the Sam E. Jeffers ROTC Scholarship in memory of his dear friend. Mr. Jeffers attended Tarleton from 1949 until 1951. After graduation from Texas A&M, Mr. Jeffers joined the Army and retired as a lieutenant colonel in the Green Berets. He served two tours in Vietnam during his career in the Army. After his retirement, Mr. Jeffers received a Master's degree in agricultural education from Tarleton. He passed away in May 1992. This scholarship is awarded to a student with a desire to serve his/her country.

THE DANNY JENKINS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in May 1990 by Mr. & Mrs. Vernon Jenkins of Hico, in memory of their son. Danny Jenkins, born in Hico, attended school in Hico and participated in sports, band, and UIL. He graduated with honors in grade school and high school. He came to Tarleton in 1967 as a Pre-Pharmacy student until 1968 when he transferred to the University of Texas in Austin. He graduated in August 1971. Danny Jenkins worked with Eckerd Drugs until his death in 1989. He was a victim of cancer. Mr. Vernon Jenkins retired as Hamilton County Judge in 1978, and retired from farming and ranching in 1984. Mrs. Pauline Jenkins retired from the nursing profession in 1984. She passed away in July 1991.

THE PAULINE "POLLY" JENKINS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in August 1991 by Mr. Vernon "Pete" Jenkins of Hico, in memory of his wife. Mrs. Jenkins was born and raised in Hico along with three brothers and one sister. She graduated from high school in 1932. She served at the Hico City Hospital as a LVN for more than twenty years. Mr. & Mrs. Jenkins raised registered Aberdeen Angus near Hico.

THE EVELYN FLOYD & LESLIE (AL) JENNINGS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1980 by Mr. Richard Phillips, a representative of the Jennings family. Leslie Jennings attended Tarleton State University and was a member of the basketball and football teams. In 1980, Mr. Jennings was inducted in the Athletics Hall of Fame. Mrs. Jennings, class of 1926, majored in Elementary Education at Tarleton. Her interests included soil preservation and erosion. This scholarship is awarded to deserving students majoring in agriculture or a related field.

THE JOHN TARLETON CLASS OF 1948 ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1998 by the John Tarleton Class of 1948 in honor of their 50 Year Reunion. The gift came about as a result of the Class of 1948 Reunion Gift Campaign through the Greater Tarleton Annual Fund. The scholarship is awarded to full time students of financial need who are classified as a sophomore or above with at least a 2.5 GPA and of good report with the student code of conduct guides for the University.

THE LAMAR AND MARILYNN T. JOHANSON SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

Established in 2012 by Dr. Lamar and Mrs. Marilyn T. Johanson through their life estate gift, this scholarship will be awarded to full time students in good standing with the University. The scholarship is given as part of their gift of nearly 1,700 acres of farm and ranch land, with mineral rights. Located in San Saba and Mills counties, their wish is for the land to be used as an academic laboratory to support Tarleton research, academic programs, and other university functions. Their gift also provides much needed scholarships and creates a maintenance endowment for the property. Dr. Johanson dedicated 40 years to Tarleton serving in many different capacities, ranging from professor of biological sciences to dean to executive director at the satellite campus in Killeen. Mrs. Johanson earned her master's degree from Tarleton, and in addition to teaching vocational home economics, she was also an educational specialist with Texas Education Agency and a public school principal. Together the Johansons have committed nearly 75 years to education.

JOHNNY JOHNSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Johnson was a professor in the College of Agriculture beginning in 1968. While at Tarleton, he trained over 1500 Vocational Agriculture Science teachers during his tenure Tarleton. In addition to his time in the classroom, Dr. Johnson served the University as Director of Placement and School Relations and as Vice

President of Student Services. Recipients shall be seniors in their last semester and enrolled in six hours of internship or student teaching and be an extension/industry or teacher certification concentration in the Department of Agricultural Services and Development.

JOHNSON COUNTY MASTER GARDENER ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2012 by the Johnson County Master Gardener Association, this scholarship is awarded to a student pursuing a degree in Horticulture with first preference given to a student from Johnson County Texas.

DANIEL JONES "BLEED PURPLE" MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016 by Paul and Carolyn Jones, in memory of their son Daniel Jones, this scholarship is awarded to a full-time student who is a non-music major, involved with the athletic pep bands, demonstrates financial need, and has a positive impact on the Tarleton Athletic Band program.

THE LAMBDA CHI ALPHA LEVI JONES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in memory of Levi Jones by Mary Lyn Jones in April of 2006. This scholarship is awarded to an initiated brother of the Lambda Chi Alpha from the Liberty Hill, Austin area, who is majoring in Exercise and Sport Studies.

THE MAY JONES SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1980 by Miss May Jones through a bequest from her estate to the Tarleton Alumni Association. The scholarship is awarded to a student pursuing a degree in Mathematics. Miss Jones was an Associate Professor of mathematics until her retirement in 1950. While a student at Tarleton, she made her home with her grandmother who lived one mile east of town. On inclement days, her grandmother permitted her to drive the buggy drawn by a white pony. Miss Jones was named chairperson of Parents Day activities in 1936, and except for World War II years, continued in that position until her retirement.

REECIE & OPAL JONES SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by Mr. and Mrs. Reecie Jones. Both graduates of Tarleton, Mr. Jones graduated in 1929 with a degree in Accounting and Mrs. Jones graduated in 1932 with a degree in English. Mr. Jones passed away in 2003 and Mrs. Jones in 2007.

THE JUSTICE STUDIES SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a student majoring in Criminal Justice, who is nominated by a Criminal Justice Faculty member.

THE LARRY JANCA KAHLBAU MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 by the family of Mr. Kahlbau. Mr. Kahlbau graduated from Tarleton in 1982. The scholarship is awarded to a Business Administration major.

AVA AND JACK KENNY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017, this scholarship is awarded annually to a full-time student with financial need.

LTC JOHN F. KERBY ARMY ROTC ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by LTC John F. Kerby, this scholarship is awarded annually to a full-time student who is a contracted member of the US Army ROTC and an active member of the Texan Corps of Cadets, with a preference for Cadets majoring in a discipline within the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences.

THE C. RICHARD KING SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a journalism major who has demonstrated a need for financial assistance in order to pursue his or her collegiate studies.

This scholarship was established in 1976 by Mrs. Violet Terrell in memory of Mr. J.V. Laird. In 1987, the scholarship was changed to the J.V. and Lillie Ruth Laird Scholarship by the request of their sons John and David Laird after the death of Mrs. Laird. Recipients of this scholarship must be majoring in Horticulture or a related field and demonstrate high academic achievement and participation.

LAMBDA CHI ALPHA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established to promote and reward scholastic achievement in undergraduate studies by the Brothers of Lambda Chi Alpha, Phi Rho Zeta at Tarleton State University. This scholarship is awarded to a student who is a sophomore or above, is an initiated Brother of Lambda Chi Alpha for at least one semester, and involved in Phi Rho Zeta for one year.

BARBARA LANCASTER SCHOLARSHIP

The Barbara Lancaster Scholarship was established by friends and family to honor the memory of Mrs. Barbara Lancaster and her love of Journalism. Mrs. Lancaster passed away in 1996.

JOHN AND JUDY LANDERS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by John and Judy Landers, this scholarship is awarded annually to an undergraduate student majoring in any degree within the College of Agricultural and Environmental Studies.

JUDY AND JOHN LANDERS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by John and Judy Landers, this scholarship is awarded annually to a member of the Tarleton Corps of Cadets with preference given to nursing majors.

THE MARGUERITE LANDRESS SCHOLARSHIP IN MUSIC

Established in 1984 by Dr. Vance Terrell of Stephenville in honor of Miss Marguerite Landress, who was a graduate of Tarleton State College in music. Miss Landress was fatally injured in an automobile accident in 1950. The award is given to a student majoring in music, studying piano on any level.

THE JAKIE LAUGHLIN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006 by AgTexas Farm Credit in honor of Mr. Jerry "Jakie" Laughlin on the occasion of his retirement from the AgTexas Board of Directors after 31 years of service. Jakie graduated from Tarleton in 1958 with an Associate's degree and went on to University of North Texas, graduating in 1959 with a Business degree. This scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student of Agribusiness or Agriculture at Tarleton. Mr. Laughlin passed away in June of 2009.

LEE LAW FIRM SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2013, this scholarship is awarded to full time first year students who demonstrate financial need.

THE JAMES C. LEETH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by Mrs. Ora Lee Leeth in memory of her husband, Dr. James C. Leeth. Dr. Leeth served in the Air Force and retired as head of the Industrial Technology Department at Tarleton in 1992. Dr. Leeth passed away in 2001. The scholarship is awarded to a student majoring in Engineering Technology.

COL. CHARLES LEIGON ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN NURSING

Established in 2012, this scholarship is will be given to full-time students pursuing a degree in nursing who are in good standing with the university.

LEWALLEN FINE ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

THE ETHEL LEWALLEN MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in memory of Ethel Lewallen by Mr. G.K. Lewallen in September of 2007. This scholarship is awarded to a full time student majoring in Art.

THE MARY GARRETT LINDLEY MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN HUMAN SCIENCES

This scholarship was established by Joe Lindley in June of 2000. This scholarship is awarded to a student in the Human Sciences department.

THE LEWIS CHARLES LINK SCHOLARSHIP

Created in February 1964 by Mrs. Sarah A. Link as a memorial to her husband. Her request was that the scholarship be used to aid worthy students planning to attend Tarleton State University.

LONE STAR AG CREDIT AGRICULTURAL SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

Established in 2017 by Lone Star Ag Credit Agricultural Fund, in order to make a positive difference in the lives of the young men and women who will lead the Ag industry. This scholarship is awarded annually to a student majoring in a discipline within the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences.

THE LONE STAR BEEFMASTER CATTLEWOMEN SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Lone Star Beefmaster Cattlewomen, this scholarship is awarded to undergraduate students majoring in agriculture.

THE JOE & TERESA LONG SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by a generous gift from Joe and Teresa Long of Austin, Texas. Mr. Long was raised in Leon County and came to Tarleton from Centerville High School. He graduated from Tarleton in 1949. After receiving his Associate degree, Mr. Long attended the University of Texas, graduating with a Bachelor's degree in Government. Mr. Long also received his J.D. degree in 1958 from the University of Texas. Teresa Long was raised in Premont, Texas. She received her Bachelor's, Master's, and Ed. D. from the University of Texas at Austin. Dr. Long is a longtime educator who served as a teacher and on the executive committee of the University Scholastic League. This scholarship is awarded to students declaring a major within the College of Education and Fine Arts or the College of Arts and Sciences.

JEFFREY P. LONGBOTHAM ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 2009 by Dr. Jack and Elisabeth Longbotham in memory of their son, Jeffrey P. Longbotham. Jeffrey was a 1981 Tarleton graduate with a major in Agribusiness. Jeffrey was a proud member of the Texan Football team while at Tarleton. This scholarship is awarded to a Junior or Senior majoring in Agribusiness.

A DIAMOND IN OUR EYES: THE SADE LOWERY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in memory of Sade Lowery in 2014. The recipient of this scholarship must be a music education major with financial need. Recipients must carry a 2.5 overall GPA and no less than a 3.0 in all music classes. The student will also be a member in good standing in an instrumental ensemble as defined by the Director of Bands.

THE GRACE LYON/DR. PEPPER ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Grace Lyon/Dr. Pepper Endowed Scholarship was established in 1992 by a gift from the estate of Mrs. Grace Lyon. Grace Prim Lyon was a pioneer in the soft drink industry. She inherited the Dublin Dr. Pepper Bottling Company in 1946 from her father, Sam Houston Prim, who founded it in 1891. The Dublin plant is the world's oldest Dr. Pepper bottling plant.

Following her husband's death, and then her father's death soon after, Mrs. Lyon assumed a leadership role in a business that was traditionally male-dominated. She was a hands-on owner, working each day with a staff who learned to respect her leadership abilities and to admire her personal integrity. With the help of her general manager, William Kloster, the decision was made to continue using Imperial Pure Cane Sugar in spite of the rising price. Because all other bottling companies were switching to the less expensive corn sweeteners, the commitment to retain the sugar recipe put the plant into a unique position in an aggressive and competitive market.

Mrs. Lyon died in 1991 at the age of 92. Ironically, she passed away on the morning that the plant was preparing to celebrate its 100th birthday. Because Mrs. Lyon had no children, she left the plant to her manager, William Kloster and his wife, Iona. Mr. Kloster died in 1999, leaving the plant to his son and grandsons. The endowment provides scholarships for students majoring in business administration.

KREEK MAGIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

Established in 2017 by Matt and Brittany Magin, in memory of their son Kreek who loved rodeo, this scholarship will be awarded annually to a full time student who is a member of the Tarleton Rodeo team, demonstrates financial need and maintains a GPA of at least 2.0. Preference is given to male students who participate in roping.

PEARL MAHAN WRITING ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was created to be given to students who advance in writing humorous works both prose and poetry.

ROSCOE AND HALCIE MAKER SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

Roscoe Maker established this scholarship in 2004 to assist students from Bosque County or Hico High School. A well-known resident of the Cross Timbers region, Mr. Maker established a flying school in the 1930s in Clinton, Oklahoma and eventually became a flight instructor for the Army Air Corps. Later, he started a flying school in Abilene and developed other business interests, including a ranch in Bosque and Hamilton counties and a hobby store in Abilene. Mr. Marker left his estate to Tarleton in a bequest. Mr. Maker passed away in 2012.

BEA MARIN VETERANS NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2009, in memory of Col. (RET) Bea Marin, this scholarship honors the life and service of Col. Marin. The scholarship was established by the VFW Post #9181 and the DAV Chapter 234 in Erath County. Col. Marin was a nursing instructor at Tarleton and served the entire Erath County community through volunteer work.

BEA MARIN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship was established in honor of the late Colonel Bea Marin. She was an instructor of leadership and management in the Tarleton nursing department. She accepted that position in 2000 following a 26-year career as a registered nurse in the U.S. Air Force. She was a member of numerous community organizations and was named Erath County Woman of the Year in 1998. Colonel Marin passed away in June 2008. Scholarships are awarded to nursing students.

GEORGE MARTIN MEMORIAL ENDOWED AGRICULTURAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by the members of the Martin family honoring George Martin, a 1971 graduate of Tarleton. Mr. Martin spent over 26 years teaching in Texas high schools and was devoted to working with young people in FFA and Young Farmers programs. The FFA recognized his years of service by honoring him for having 188 students who achieved the Lone Star Farmer award. This scholarship is awarded to a full-time student majoring in an agriculture related field.

STACEY AND ROBERT MARTIN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Stacey Watkins Martin, this scholarship is awarded annually to full-time students that graduated from N Central Tx Academy - Happy Hill - Glen Rose, Tx.

WILLIE I., WANDA, AND W.F. MARTIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in 2006 by the trustee of the Willie I., Wanda, and W.F. Martin Charitable Trust, this fund supports the Agriculture Student Ambassador Scholarship and the Agriculture Judging Team Scholarship.

THE TSU MATHEMATICS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Created in 1989, the TSU Mathematics Club Scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student in the area of Mathematics.

FRANK AND SUE MAYBORN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by The Frank W. and Sue Mayborn Foundation, this scholarship is awarded to students pursuing degree programs at Tarleton State University- Central Texas who have a GPA of at least 2.75 and are enrolled in at least 9 undergraduate semester hours or 6 graduate semester hours.

LYNDA K. AND A. DWAIN MAYFIELD ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN ENGINEERING

Because of their strong belief in the importance of a university education and because of the rich and rewarding life that the engineering profession has brought them, Dwain and Lynda Mayfield want to provide an aspiring student interested in pursuing a degree in engineering a scholarship that helps achieve that goal.

THE DENNIS AND MARY LOU MCCABE PRESIDENTIAL ENDOWMENT

This endowment was established in 2008 by friends of Drs. Dennis and Mary Lou McCabe in honor of their leadership and service as the president and first lady of Tarleton. Dr. McCabe served as Tarleton's president from 1991-2008. This scholarship is awarded to students demonstrating financial need, meritorious leadership, and scholastic aptitude.

COOPER MCCARTY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by Jon and Jessica Brown, this scholarship is awarded to a full or part time student in good standing who is a graduate of DeLeon, TX High School.

THE RUTH SCHRIMSHIRE MCCLESKEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1981 by Dr. C.S. McCleskey as a memorial to his wife. It is designed to aid worthy and deserving students.

THE LTC JACK D. MCCULLOUGH SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1979 by Mrs. Helen McCullough in memory of her husband. Col. McCullough, a native of Tacoma, Washington, lived in Stephenville for 40 years. He entered the Army in 1924 at Fort Lewis, Washington and came to the Tarleton ROTC staff in 1937 as a sergeant from Fort Sam Houston. In 1941, he was commissioned at Fort Benning, Georgia and returned to Tarleton as PMS&T. While at Tarleton, he was promoted to captain and later served in Japan during the occupation forces. In 1953, he retired as a Lieutenant Colonel. The scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student who plans to enroll and complete ROTC at Tarleton.

JAY R. MCDANEL EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the McDanel family, the scholarship honors Jay, who was a veteran educator. Throughout his years in the classroom, he demonstrated an appreciation for the value of a quality education and experienced first-hand how important financial assistance can be to students. Established in 2004 by Tolly Moore, this scholarship is awarded to students pursuing degree programs at Tarleton State University- Central Texas. Recipients must have a GPS of at least 3.0.

RUSSELL L. MOORE ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by Russell L. Moore, this scholarship is awarded annually to a full-time student in accounting or finance with a GPA greater than 2.5 and with financial need.

THE JOHN MITCHELL MOORE NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

The John Mitchell Moore Nursing Scholarship was established in 2008 to honor John M. Moore on his retirement from FMC Technologies. Mr. Moore served on the Tarleton Foundation Board of Directors and is very involved in the Stephenville community. This scholarship is awarded to students from Erath County majoring in Nursing.

DONALD W. AND DAHLEE MORTON ENDOWED PIANO SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in honor of Dr. Don Morton to assist a full-time Tarleton student majoring in piano. The student is expected to maintain an exemplary attendance and participation record in music classes. Dr. Morton served Tarleton with great distinction as Head of the Department of Music and Art from 1945 through 1976.

CLIFTON J. MORVANT ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 in honor of Clifton J. Morvant by his wife Virginia. Mr. Morvant, a longtime Assistant Professor of Agricultural Services and Development at Tarleton, officially retired from the University in May of 1998 after serving for thirty years. This scholarship is awarded to senior level students in the Agricultural Services and Development area.

MIKE MYERS AND OSCAR FRAZIER TRACK SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Tarleton Track and Field Alumni Association The recipient shall be a full-time student in good standing pursuing a degree from Tarleton State University and must also be a track and field athlete.

HOWARD NANCE CHEMICAL SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

Tarleton's student Chemical Society raised and donated the money to establish an endowed scholarship in honor of Howard Nance, former faculty member and longtime society advisor. Mr. Nance sponsored the Chemistry Club for more than 30 years. The scholarship will be awarded to a College of Science and Technology student who is an active member of the Chemical Society.

NEPALESE STUDENT SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in 2006 by the Nepalese Student Society, this scholarship is awarded to a student in good academic standing in the Clinical Laboratory Science program.

ROBERT W. NEWBY SCHOLARSHIP IN PSYCHOLOGICAL SCIENCES

Established in 2018 by Robert and Kim Rynearson, this scholarship is awarded annually to a non-first semester Psychology major. This scholarship was established in honor of Robert W. Newby, the Department of Psychology's founding professor who joined Tarleton faculty in 1975.

LEWIS AND INA NEWTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016 by Dr. Weldon Newton, Mr. Joe Lane, and Mrs. Anita Lane, this scholarship is awarded annually to a student who has declared a major in Agriculture, Education, or Engineering and has a minimum GPA of 3.0. Preference is given to graduates of Cross Plains High School.

The Lewis and Ina Newton Memorial Scholarship was established by the children and descendants of the couple to honor their emphasis, patience, and persistence in assuring that each of their five children obtain a college degree. Long-time farmers and residents of the Cross Cut community in northern Brown County, all five of their children are graduates of Cross Plains High School. Three attended Tarleton State University as a junior college. All of their children went on to earned bachelor's and other advance degrees from other Texas universities. Twenty-one descendants followed suit, attending Tarleton to earn part-time credit or bachelor's and master's degrees in succeeding years.

HAROLD D. NIX MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by the family of Harold D. Nix. The scholarship is awarded to students seeking agricultural related degrees. Harold D. was a 1996 graduate of Tarleton. An Agricultural Services and Development major, he appreciated the importance of agriculture in maintaining a quality of life for everyone. His family believes that creating a scholarship fund to encourage the continued education of students in agricultural related fields would best honor his memory.

W.L. (BILL) & BARBARA TERRELL NIX HONORS PROGRAM STUDY ABROAD ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Created in 2015 by Beverlee Nix and William K. and Cindy Nix, this scholarship is awarded annually to a recipient who is a full time student in the Tarleton State University Honors Program and who elects to participate in any official university study abroad program.

GREGORY NOWLIN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by the Tarleton State University Foundation, this scholarship benefits high achieving high school students invited to apply for early admission to Tarleton State University.

DR. MAY OWEN MEDICAL LAB SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by Dr. and Mrs. Lamar Johanson as the Clinical Laboratory Sciences Scholarship. In 2010 they changed the name to the Dr. May Owen Memorial Medical Laboratory Sciences Scholarship. The Johansons have long been supporters of Tarleton and its students. Dr. Johanson served as an educator and in various leadership positions at Tarleton for 40 years before his retirement in the spring of 2001. While serving as Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Dr. Johanson was instrumental in the formation of the Clinical Laboratory Science degree program in Fort Worth.

DOUGLAS B. PAIR PRE-PHARMACY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Douglas B. Pair Pre-Pharmacy Scholarship Fund is awarded annually to students attending Tarleton State University taking courses for the purpose of earning a Pharm. D. degree from an accredited college or school of pharmacy.

THE PAUL PAIR ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the students and faculty members of the Computer Information Systems Department at Tarleton State University. It is awarded to undergraduate CIS majors and graduate students who are including CIS emphasis in their graduate degree programs.

THE JOHN D. & ALENE MOORMAN PALMER ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2000 by Mr. and Mrs. C. Robert Palmer of Houston in honor of his parents. Mr. and Mrs. John Palmer were 1929 graduates of John Tarleton Agricultural College. Both served on the J-TAC staff. Mrs. Palmer was feature editor for the 1929 Grassburr and Mr. Palmer was First Sergeant in the 1929 Non-Commissioned Officers Club. The scholarship is awarded to deserving students majoring in elementary or secondary education, and/or elementary administration.

THE JOE PARISH ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1967 by the Tarleton Ex-Students Association. They established this scholarship as a memorial to Mr. Parish, who served as president of the Tarleton Ex-Students Association.

PARTNER'S CIRCLE SCHOLARSHIP

The Partner's Circle was established in 2011 as an alliance between Tarleton and businesses and corporations wanting to contribute to student scholarships. All funds gifted to the Partner's Circle go directly to student scholarships.

PANHANDLE-PLAINS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded annually to a deserving graduate student.

THE LOY PATTON SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Mrs. Mildred Thorman, LVN of the Tri-County program. Ms. Loy Patton was a nurse in Erath County for many years and served as director of the LVN program at Harris Methodist Hospital in Stephenville. This scholarship was established to benefit a deserving student who is pursuing a degree in nursing.

DONALD T. PENDLETON SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in 2014 from the estate of Mr. Donald T. Pendleton. He bequeathed a portion of his estate to Tarleton to be used for scholarships for undergraduate students in good standing with the University who are majoring in Range and Ranch Management which has been renamed to Ecosystem Sciences.

THE DONALD T. & BETTEJOE R. PENDLETON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by Mr. and Mrs. Donald Pendleton of Caddo, Texas. The scholarship is awarded to students majoring in Agronomy and/or Range Management. Mrs. Pendleton passed away in 2006 and Mr. Pendleton passed away in 2012.

DORRIS AND GRADY PERRY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established from a gift from the estate of Wilbur W. Perry this scholarship is awarded to a junior or senior student majoring in a business related field within the College of Business Administration.

RAY AND PAT PETERS SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

Established in 2018 by Ray and Pat Peters, this scholarship is awarded annually to student scholars with financial need.

ANN BULECZA PETRONIS NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1991 for honor students in History at Tarleton.

THE OTHO AND ELLEN PHILLIPS ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP

Established by descendants and friends of Otho and Ellen Phillips to assist first generation college students from Comanche, Brown, and contiguous counties within the north Texas area in pursuing a college degree at Tarleton State University. FRANCINE ESPISITO PRATT SOCIAL WORK ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by the Student Social Work Association, this scholarship is awarded annually to social work students with financial need.

PRESIDENT'S CIRCLE SCHOLARSHIP

The President's Circle is a group of generous donors who make annual contributions to advance the mission of the University. This scholarship is awarded to deserving full time students with a GPA of 3.0 or above.

THE PRESIDENT'S FIRST GENERATION STUDENT SUCCESS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2010 by Tarleton State University President, Dr. F. Dominic Dottavio and his wife, Dr. Lisette Dottavio, to encourage retention and student success. This scholarship is awarded to a first generation college student.

THE ALEX PRICE & RUBY B. FAMBRO AGRICULTURE SCHOLARSHIP

THE ALEX PRICE & RUBY B. FAMBRO RODEO SCHOLARSHIP

The Alex Price and Ruby B. Fambro Scholarships were a charitable gift given to the Tarleton State University Foundation, Inc., by Mr. Raymond Lee Fambro, who was a resident of Erath County and a member of the Tarleton Class of 1943. These memorial scholarships are dedicated to the memory of his parents.

THE MARSHALL "DIGGER" PROCTER ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This scholarship was established in 2005 by Dr. Dannah Procter in memory of her husband, Marshall "Digger" Procter. Digger, a 1963 graduate of Tarleton, is a member of the Tarleton State University Athletic Hall of Fame. Digger passed away in 1999. Established by the Zeta Beta Chapter of Kappa Delta Rho in November of 2002, this scholarship is awarded to students who are sophomore or above, an initiated brother of Kappa Delta Rho, and involved with Zeta Beta.

RICHARD E. SAUNDERS SCHOLARSHIP

Mr. Richard Saunders was a supporter and benefactor of Tarleton State University. He was a graduate of Tarleton and had a long and interesting career in the field of aviation. Mr. Saunders passed away in 2008. This scholarship was established to benefit deserving students at Tarleton.

THE RICHARD C. SCHAFFER MEDICAL LAB SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

The Richard C. Schaffer Medical Lab Sciences Scholarship was established in 1993 by the faculty of the Medical Technology Division at Tarleton. Dr. Schaffer was an important contributor and friend to Tarleton for many years. He passed away in 2015.

THE ANNIE MYRA SCHUMAN NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

Created from a gift by John Caraway of Stephenville and the Chevron Corporation in September 1989. Born in Alabama, Mrs. Shuman moved to Comanche County as a child and received her nursing certification in 1924. Over the next 50 years, she served as a nurse in Gorman, Eastland, Comanche, Baird, and DeLeon. She retired from nursing in 1973 and passed away in 1981.

DR. VERNE A. & PEARL KERN SCOTT SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1989 by Robert Scott of Grand Lake, CO, formerly of Stephenville, in honor of his grandparents. Verne Scott, D.V.M., Sr., was part of the Tarleton faculty from 1920 to 1947 as a professor of veterinary science and animal husbandry at what was then John Tarleton Agricultural College. After working his way through Texas A&M University, he later attended Kansas City Veterinary College before joining the Tarleton College faculty. Orphaned at age 13, financial need was prevalent during his early life. Both Verne and Pearl were very active with campus life. Pearl served as president of the Tarleton Campus Club in the 1930s. As a faculty member, Verne worked tirelessly to help students. Verne was a practicing veterinarian in the Stephenville area until his death in 1963. Both were admired greatly within the Tarleton community.

THE SECOND CHANCE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1995 by the former students of Mrs. June Shannon. Mrs. Shannon served as a high school English teacher for many years at Stephenville High School. She earned her AA degree from Tarleton in 1931, her BS degree at Daniel Baker College in 1936, and her MS degree from Abilene Christian College in 1959. She taught high school English in Brown County before moving to Stephenville to teach English for eighteen years. Mrs. Shannon authored several books and loved writing poetry. She was selected as the 1982 Distinguished Alumni by the Tarleton Alumni Association. The scholarship is awarded to a deserving student from Erath, San Saba, Brown, Coleman, or Callahan county. This scholarship was established by the friends and family of Dr. Richard T. Shigley. Throughout his career at Tarleton, Shigley served as the Director of Criminal Justice, as well as an Associate Professor in the criminal justice program, and as the Department Head of Social Work, Sociology and Criminal Justice. THE DICK SMITH ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2014 in memory of Cheryl Spellmeier who devoted 14 years to the Tarleton football program. Although she worked as their secretary, she will be most remembered for being a mother figure to the many student athletes who passed by her desk daily.

THE BRETT ALLEN "SIMPLE" SPINDOR MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by Fred and Marlys Spindor in memory of their son, Brett Spindor. This scholarship is awarded to an undergraduate student who is an active member of the Alpha Gamma Rho Fraternity.

ANNE SPITLER MATHEMATICS SCHOLARSHIP

The recipient of this scholarship will be a sophomore student or higher majoring in Mathematics or Mathematics Education, with financial need.

THE SPRINGFIELD FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Established in 1993 by Mr. and Mrs. Carl Crimmins to honor the Springfield family. It is awarded to an outstanding Criminal Justice major.

This endowment was established in August 2014 by Bill Stallworth for a full time Tarleton State University student who is participating in the College of Business Administration Study Abroad program.

DR. LESLIE STANLEY-STEVENSON AND DR. W.H. STANLEY SR ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Originally created in 2006 in memory of Dr. W.H. Stanley, Sr., this fund was renamed in 2016 in memorial to Dr. Leslie Stanley-Stevens. Leslie was professor of sociology and Texas A&M University System Regents Professor at Tarleton State University. She was a loving mother and wife, beloved and inspiring teacher and colleague, an accomplished researcher, and an internationally recognized scholar. This scholarship is awarded annually to a student who has successfully completed at least 30 hours of undergraduate work, has declared a major in Sociology (first preference given to pre-Ministry concentration), and has demonstrated providing support in developing the Sociology program through being an active member of the Sociology club and/or has presented or will present at a professional conference.

Established in 1997 by Dr. and Mrs. David Stanphill of Stephenville. Dr. Stanphill is a 1983 graduate of Tarleton State University, and Mrs. Stanphill graduated in 1997 with a Nursing degree. Shall be awarded to a full time incoming freshmen, 1st generation students, demonstrated financial need, but not PELL eligible, SAT scores of 1000 or higher or ACT of 23 or higher. Must maintain 2.75 for the spring disbursement selection criteria.

DEANNA SUPERCINSKI & JANNA WALKER ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 in memory of Rick Tackett. This scholarship is awarded to a student majoring in an Agriculture related field and involved in Rodeo related activities.

Established in 2005 by James Tally. This scholarship is awarded to students graduating from any public high school in Taylor County.

TARLETON ALUMNI ASSOCIATION BAYLOR NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student in Nursing at Tarleton State University.

TARLETON ALUMNI ASSOCIATION T.C. & JILL GRANBERRY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 by the Tarleton Alumni Association, this scholarship honors two very good friends of Tarleton State University. This scholarship is awarded to a child or grandchild of a former student at Tarleton State University.

TARLETON ALUMNI ASSOCIATION DENNIS HANCOCK SCHOLARSHIP

Dennis Hancock, Tarleton Class of 1965, was an architect who made a significant contribution to the Tarleton Alumni Association in the design and construction of the Tarleton Military Memorial. Dennis passed away in 2001. This scholarship was named after him in honor of his contributions.

TARLETON ALUMNI ASSOCIATION STARK SCHOLARSHIP

The recipient shall be a full-time student in good standing with the University. Awarded to a worthy, deserving student at Tarleton State University.

TARLETON ALUMNI ASSOCIATION GREGORY SCOTT SULTEMEIER ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

TARLETON PROFESSIONAL EDUCATORS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 by the Tarleton Professional Educators Association. This scholarship is awarded to students in the Teacher Education program who seek initial certification through traditional course work.

TARLETON STATE UNIVERSITY MIDDLE SCHOOL MATHEMATICS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2011, this scholarship is awarded to a full time student who is a member of Tarleton Educators for the Advancement of Mathematics (TEAM) majoring in Interdisciplinary Studies with Middle School Math Certification.

TARLETON STATE UNIVERSITY PARENTS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Tarleton Parents Association.

TARLETON RESIDENT ADVISOR SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Resident Advisors Association in 1992, the scholarship is awarded to a current resident advisor at Tarleton State University.

THE ROY L. & MATTIE TATE SCHOLARSHIP

The Roy L. and Mattie Tate Scholarship was established in 1982. It is awarded to provide assistance to needy and worthy students from Erath County. This scholarship enables students to pursue a degree in agriculture or education.

THE WILLIE L. & EVE K. TATE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1998 by a generous gift from Col. (Ret.) Willie L. Tate, a 1935 graduate of John Tarleton Agricultural College. Honored as Tarleton's 1988 Distinguished Alumnus he served on the Tarleton Alumni Association Board of Directors, and as President of the Tarleton State University Foundation, Inc. Board of Directors. Col. Tate was the recipient of the Honorary Doctor of Letters degree in December 2002. The Vance & Violet Terrell Endowed Scholarship in Nursing was established by Dr. Frank Terrell, M.D. and Mrs. Penny Elliott, in memory of their mother and father. THE LEE EDWIN TERRY HUMAN SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

The Lee Edwin Terry Human Sciences Scholarship was established in 1984 by Joe and Mary (Garrett) Lindley in honor of Miss Terry. It was established for deserving Human Sciences majors. DR. BARRY B. THOMPSON THEATRE SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Barry B. Thompson served as the 13th President of Tarleton State University. In 1994, Dr. Thompson was appointed as Chancellor of The Texas A&M System, a position he served in until his retirement in 1999. Dr. Thompson had a great love for Tarleton and the students of Tarleton. This scholarship was established while Dr. Thompson served as President. Recipients must be a deserving student with outstanding theatre performance.

BARRY B. THOMPSON SCIENCE EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

Created in 2015 by Sandra Thompson, this scholarship is awarded annually to a recipient who is a full time student majoring in one of the science disciplines preparing to become a teacher.

THE RICHARD L. THOMPSON ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established through the estate of Dr. Richard L. Thompson, this scholarship is awarded to full-time students majoring in Agriculture and Music with a required GPA of at least 2.5, and demonstrating financial need.

THORMANN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN NURSING

Lorraine went on to graduate from the University of Texas in Austin; Bernie graduated from Texas A&M. They were married in Stephenville in 1932. Lorraine was a member of the Tarleton faculty in the Department of Home Economics in the 1930's. Bernie became a civil engineer. He designed bridges in Texas and built turnpikes in Maine, Massachusetts and Florida.

Lorraine's mom lived on North Cain Street near Tarleton for 39 years. One year Tarleton students saved her furniture when her house caught fire as the house next door burned to the ground.

The scholarship was created in their memory by their son, Donald and his wife Lorraine, to help aspiring young people with similar backgrounds.

THE TOWN & COUNTRY BANK DUBLIN HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 by the Board of Directors of Town & Country Bank. The scholarship is awarded to an outstanding Dublin High School graduate who wishes to pursue a degree from Tarleton.

Mrs. Trogdon passed away July 2000, and Dr. Trogdon passed away in January 2011. The scholarship is awarded to a deserving student with a minimum of 30 hours.

TSU FOUNDATION ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 by the Tarleton State University Foundation, this scholarship is awarded to engineering students.

TSU MEATS TEAM ALUMNI ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to students who are members of the current Meats Team and are in good standing with Tarleton State University.

DIMPLE OBEDIA TUNNELL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 through the estate of Mrs. Tunnell, who worked for many years in the Tarleton Dining Hall as a cook beginning in 1958. She retired in 1974 at the age of 70. She and her husband had no children of their own, but took in many students. She passed away July 27, 1999. This scholarship is for students in need, studying in the fields of nursing or any medically related field.

THE ROGER & RUTH TURNEY MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1996 by Paula Brewer and family. This scholarship is awarded to an undergraduate student who is classified as a non-traditional student.

THE TXU MATH & SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by the TXU Energy Company of Dallas, Texas. The scholarship is awarded to outstanding students majoring in Math and/or Science at Tarleton State University.

DR. SARA TYLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Sara Tyler had a great love of reading. She touched the lives of countless students and teachers during her years as an educator, and her love of reading was matched by her passion for life. Dr. Tyler had been a member of the Tarleton faculty for 11 years when she died in a parachuting accident in December 2003. An Associate Professor, Dr. Tyler served as director of undergraduate and graduate reading programs, chaired graduate committees, and helped found the Master Reading Teacher Program at the University. In 2003, Dr. Tyler was named posthumously as a recipient of the Ted Booker Award in Education by the Texas Teacher Educators Association. This scholarship was established in 2007 by the friends and family of Dr. Tyler to assist students seeking a graduate degree in Curriculum and Instruction with an emphasis in Reading.

Family and friends established the Clyde H. Wells Scholarship in 1987 in honor of the former Tarleton State University alumnus and longtime Chairman of the Board of Regents for The Texas A&M University System. Mr. Wells was a native of Stephenville and a graduate of Tarleton and Texas A&M University. He was a successful rancher and investor who contributed to the educational and agricultural systems in Texas. He served on the Board of Regents for 24 years, served as Chairman of the Council of Governing Boards of Texas Colleges and Universities, and was a director for the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association, the Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show, and the Texas A&M Research Foundation. The Fine Arts Center was dedicated in Mr. Wells' honor in 1980. Mr. Wells died in January 1987. His wife, Mrs. Marie Wells of Granbury, passed away in 2009. Their daughter, Lana, and her husband, Raye Collier, reside in Dallas.

STANLEY G. AND MARY ANN WESTBROOK SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship is awarded to an agriculture major with preference given to an Erath County student with secondary consideration given to any Texas student. The recipient must demonstrate leadership in extracurricular activities with preference given to students who are members of Alpha Gamma Delta sorority or any University related fraternity. The recipient must also demonstrate financial need.

THE LUCILE W. WHISENAND ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established as a memorial by her husband, Mr. Norman R. Whisenand, in November 1972. The late Mrs. Whisenand graduated from Tarleton State College August 24, 1935, with an Associate degree in Science.

WICHITA FARM AND RANCH SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1989 by the Wichita Farm and Ranch Club, this scholarship is awarded to a full time upperclassman from the Wichita Falls area pursuing a degree in Agriculture. Students are selected based on scholarship, achievement, character, and need.

THE JANA WILLIAMSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Mr. Joe Howard in memory of his wife in 1976. Ms. Williamson was a Tarleton student who was killed in a car accident. At the time of her death, she was a senior business major, a member of the Tarleton rodeo team, and was elected rodeo queen in 1975. She was ranked among the top 15 barrel racers in the Southwest Region of the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association. The scholarship is awarded to a rodeo athlete.

THE WILLIS-GORDON ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by Mrs. Alice Gordon. This scholarship benefits full-time undergraduate students with at least 30 semester credit hours and a minimum GPA of 2.80, displaying financial need.

THE C.A. WISDOM MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

The C.A. Wisdom Endowed Music Scholarship was established in 1979 by Coach W. J. Wisdom as a memorial to his wife Creola (Cree) Ann Wisdom. Mrs. Wisdom was very active in the music club, garden club, and she taught piano for many years in Stephenville. This scholarship is based on music performance, character, and need. Recipients must maintain a 2.75 overall GPA and a 3.0 GPA in music, audition required.

THE EVELYN WISDOM MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 through a gift from the estate of Ms. Evelyn Wisdom. Ms. Wisdom was a 1925 graduate of John Tarleton Agriculture College. The scholarship is awarded to a student majoring in history.

THE KATHLEEN WISDOM ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Miss Kathleen Wisdom passed away in 2008 at the age of 99. She left a bequest to Tarleton to establish this scholarship endowment to assist students majoring in math. Miss Wisdom had a great love of math and loved teaching math to students for many years.

THE W.J. WISDOM SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Tarleton Alumni Association to honor W. J. Wisdom. Mr. Wisdom was a native of Oklahoma, a 1937 graduate of John Tarleton Agricultural College, a Navy veteran of World War II, and an architect in the Houston area. The scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student majoring in Physical Education.

THE HAL & WINNIE WRIGHT SCHOLARSHIP

The Hal & Winnie Wright Scholarship was established in 1985 from the estate of Mrs. Winnie Wright. It is awarded to a deserving student planning to attend Tarleton State University.

COL. (RET) RAY AND PAT YANTIS ROTC SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

Col. Ray Yantis established this scholarship in 2010 to benefit students participating in the ROTC program at Tarleton. Col. Yantis was a highly decorated World War II veteran. Among his many honors, he received a Purple Heart, the Silver Star, and the Bronze Star for his service in the U.S. Army. He graduated from Tarleton in 1940 with a degree in engineering. Col. Yantis passed away in February 2011.

MARTY YATES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Marty Yates was a member of the Tarleton Rodeo team when he passed away from injuries in an automobile accident. This scholarship is awarded each year to winners of the all-around championship of the scholarship rodeo and events when funds are available. Students must use the scholarship within two years of winning the scholarships and the recipients must maintain a full-time student status (12 or more semester hours) and be an active member of the N.I.R.A. (National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association).

ZONTA CLUB BEULAH BROWN RODEO SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Stephenville Zonta Club to honor Mrs. Beulah Brown's long time rodeo achievements and community involvement both in Stephenville and Dublin.

ZONTA CLUB JUANITA DIXON SINGLE PARENT ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2008 by the Zonta Club of Stephenville. This scholarship is awarded to a full time female, single parent student, seeking a degree.

ZONTA CLUB LOY PATTON SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the local Zonta Club to assist Nursing majors at Tarleton. Ms. Loy Patton was a nurse in Erath County for many years, served as director of the LVN program at Harris Methodist Hospital in Stephenville and was a member of the Zonta Club.
