JOB DESCRIPTION

We are hiring nursing staff technicians who are responsible for in-house patient care for the 2017 foaling season. The hours are from 5:30 a.m.-6 p.m. or from 5:30 p.m. to 6 a.m. for 3-4 12 hour shifts a week (depending on the time of year), including at least one weekend shift consistently a week. This job involves working with horses of all ages and breeds. Teamwork and a positive attitude is a must! This is a great opportunity for anyone considering veterinary medicine as a career or just to expand your knowledge on equine medicines and procedures. Be sure to be detailed in your hands on horse experience on your resume.

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Following clinician's orders
- Making a patient treatment list
- Preparing and administering medications
- Monitoring patient's vital signs and reporting any abnormalities or concerns to the shift supervisor
- Monitoring fluids
- Pulling blood from an intravenous catheter
- Performing basic lab test
- Assisting veterinarians as needed
- Stocking and cleaning assigned barns pharmacies, as well as general horse

Qualifications:

- This job is physically demanding and requires candidates that are able to frequently lift over 50 to 75 pounds and stand for long periods of time
- A minimum of two years of horse experience (other than working with your own horses) is required
