Examples of Scholarly Activities

Level I

A Level I scholarly activity is generally defined as an activity (e.g., publication, presentation, grant proposal, recognition, or journal editorial board service) that is targeted for dissemination at the <u>national</u> or <u>international</u> level. Examples include:

- Award (Recognition for scholarship/research at the national or international level)
- Book (Author or co-author of textbook or textbook chapter related to the academic field)*
- Editorial Board (Editor or Board Member of a peer-reviewed journal [high impact publication as determined by department] at the national or international level)
- Grant (Application @ national [external] level funded or non-funded)
- Presentation (Invited @ national or international level)
- Presentation (Professional peer-reviewed @ national or international conference)
- Publication (Peer-reviewed [high impact publication as determined by department] in a national or international publication)*
- Accreditation Self-Study (Primary author, initial self-study)*
- Other Substantiated Scholarly Activity

Level II

A Level II scholarly activity is generally defined as an activity (e.g., publication, presentation, grant proposal, recognition, or journal editorial board service) that is targeted for dissemination at the <u>state</u> or <u>regional</u> level. Examples include:

- Award (Recognition for scholarship/research at the state or regional level)
- Book (Editor or co-editor of a book related to the academic field **OR** Author of a supplementary-type book related to the academic field)*
- Editorial Board (Editor or Board Member of a peer-reviewed journal at the state or regional level)
- Grant (Application @ state or regional [external] level funded or non-funded)
- Presentation (Invited @ state or regional level)
- Presentation (Professional peer-reviewed @ state or regional conference)
- Publication (Peer-reviewed in a state or regional publication, including external university pub)*
- Accreditation Self-Study (Primary author, renewal self-study)*
- Other Substantiated Scholarly Activity

Level III

A Level III scholarly activity is generally defined as an activity (e.g., publication, presentation, grant proposal, recognition, or journal editorial board service) that is targeted for dissemination at the <u>university</u> or <u>local</u> level. Examples include:

- Award (Recognition for scholarship/research at the university or local level)
- Book (Custom textbook, workbook, or lab manual at the university or local level)
- Editorial Board (Editor or Board Member of a university-sponsored journal, newsletter, other)
- Grant (Internally funded)
- Presentation (Invited @ university or local event)
- Presentation (Professional peer-reviewed @ university or local event)
- Publication (Peer-reviewed in university-sponsored journal, newsletter, other)
- Other Substantiated Scholarly Activity
