1. * The EDAD 5300 Foundations of Educational Leadership course must be taken during the first 12 hours of coursework within this plan of study, and can be taken in conjunction with another/other EDAD core class(es) during the *initial* semester(s) of student participation in the program.
2. **The concluding program courses, EDAD 5398 Principal Practicum 1 & EDAD 5399 Principal Practicum 2 are available for participation at the conclusion of the program. They cannot be taken concurrently, but can be taken with other courses.
3. Upon program completion, candidate must pass the Principal as Instructional Leader Certification Exams to apply to TEA for the Principal Standard Certification.
4. Candidates must receive approval from the Coordinator of Principal Certification Program prior to taking the TExES Principal Certification exams (268 & PASL). Eligibility to take the exam is based on candidate's readiness, which includes participation in a test preparation review session within the practicum.
5. To remain in good standing, students are expected to maintain a 3.0 GPA.
