Rationale for Inclusion in this Category:

ART 231: Art History I emphasizes Critical Thinking, Communication, Teamwork, and Social Responsibility. Moreover, this course is designed to introduce students to the development of period styles in the Western tradition from prehistoric times to the late Middle Ages. Students will also acquire knowledge of the principal artists and architects of this period.

Course SLO(s): Students will express ideas about art and architecture

Learning Activities: Class lectures, reading assignments and classroom discussions.

Means of Assessment: Team presentations, paper and embedded essay questions on selected tests. Common rubric with two graders will be used to grade paper and essays; rubric criteria will include items pertaining to writing style and vocabulary.

Core Objective: Teamwork TW1: Students will work in coordination to complete specific tasks.

Course SLO(s): Student teams discuss artistic and cultural content from a variety of historic periods.

Learning Activities: Group presentation on specific periods of art history.

Means of Assessment: Common rubric with two graders will be used to grade group presentation.

Core Objective: Social Responsibility SR1: Students will demonstrate an understanding of different cultural perspectives

Course SLO(s): Students recognize cultural diversity as expressed through art.

Learning Activities: Class lectures, reading assignments and classroom discussions.

Means of Assessment: Embedded questions on selected tests.
