

Most of the teachers within my major were very out of touch with the enterprise, but most importantly: Online labs that are purchased in addition to paying the school lab fees? The online labs don't teach anything whatsoever (they're quite literally saying exactly what to do, then just take a screenshot and submit). They're a waste of time and money, and serve no educational purpose since they don't tell you WHY you're doing what you're doing or what the command even does that you just typed. Labs can be virtual, but they need to be more focused on what's expected in the enterprise, not what's expected of a small-town computer shop. Another thing for all CIS majors-- it would be incredibly helpful if there was much more emphasis on learning PowerShell and BASH scripting. That neither was taught and it's easily 50% of what I do every day (and most of my friends that have enterprise jobs in IT) is scary.
