Biographical Note

Kindred Pemberton was born in Missouri on December 30, 1851. His parents were John O. and Alvazena Felts Pemberton. During his adult life, Pemberton was a rancher in Erath County near Berlin, Texas and was postmaster of Berlin, Texas in 1888. He died on August 31, 1931 and was buried in Mt. Zion Cemetery in Stephenville, Texas.

The item, an interline waybill, documents the shipping activities of Kindred Pemberton, a rancher from Berlin, Erath County, Texas in 1900. The waybill was issued by the St. Louis Southwestern Railway Company, also known as the Cotton Belt Route, on October 11, 1900. Two packages were shipped from Memphis, Tennessee to Stephenville, Texas. The consigner was Kindred Pemberton, and the destination was P.O. Berlin, a community in northwest Erath County.
