Biographical Note

Stanley S. Slotkin (1905-1997) was a Los Angeles businessman who collected antique bibles and other rare books, which he regularly donated to various museums, universities, churches, and libraries across the United States. In the 1960s Slotkin began donating individual leaves from books to institutions rather than whole works. He disassembled a number of books, and donated sets of pages to any institution that would agree to display them publically. He also contributed to a number of causes during his life. Born in New York City, Slotkin died in 1997 in Beverly Hills.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of 12 individual leaves removed from various, rare religious texts. Each leaf was mounted onto a sheet of paper which also includes a facsimile of the cover page of the work from which the leaf originally came. Archival staff removed each leaf from the paper and encapsulated it in a polyethylene sleeve in order to access both sides of the leaf.
