Biographical Note

Lena Rivers Lewis was born in Kentucky on October 10, 1881 to John Waller (1832-1895) and Mary Bibb Lewis (1835-1918). She was only three months old when her family moved to Leon County, Texas where her father bought 100 acres 15 miles southwest of Centerville.

Lewis was a professor of history at John Tarleton Agricultural College (now known as Tarleton State University) in Stephenville in the 1920s and 1930s. Dean J. Thomas Davis tasked her with working on the American Guide Book Project, an encyclopedia developed by the Works Progress Administration (WPA), in 1936. In addition to teaching, Lewis was the dietitian as well as manager of the girl's dormitory. During her spare time, she directed the landscaping of John Tarleton campus.

Lewis died in Dallas, Texas on December 20, 1940 and was buried in the West End Cemetery in Stephenville, Texas. The 1941 issue of The Grassburr, the yearbook of John Tarleton Agricultural College, was dedicated to her memory. Lena Lewis Hall, a girls' dormitory on Tarleton campus, was named for her.

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of correspondence, assignments, notes, and manuscripts created by Lena Lewis as she worked on the Works Progress Administration (WPA) American Guide Book Project in 1936. The major portion of the correspondence is between Lewis and Ada Davis, the local supervisor in Waco, Texas. Davis sent assignments in outline form to Lewis. The notes and manuscripts are both handwritten and typed.

The items of special interest are found in Box 1: a history of Stephenville College, 1880-1914; a biography of John Tarleton; a list of preachers who served the settlements; a handwritten (as well as typed) chart of some early settlers; and a biography of J. Thomas Davis. The 1931 Texas House Bill No. 333 establishing policies for a system of state highways is found in Box 2.

The Lena Lewis Manuscripts were in no discernable original order when found in the repository. The materials remain in the order in which they were found.
