

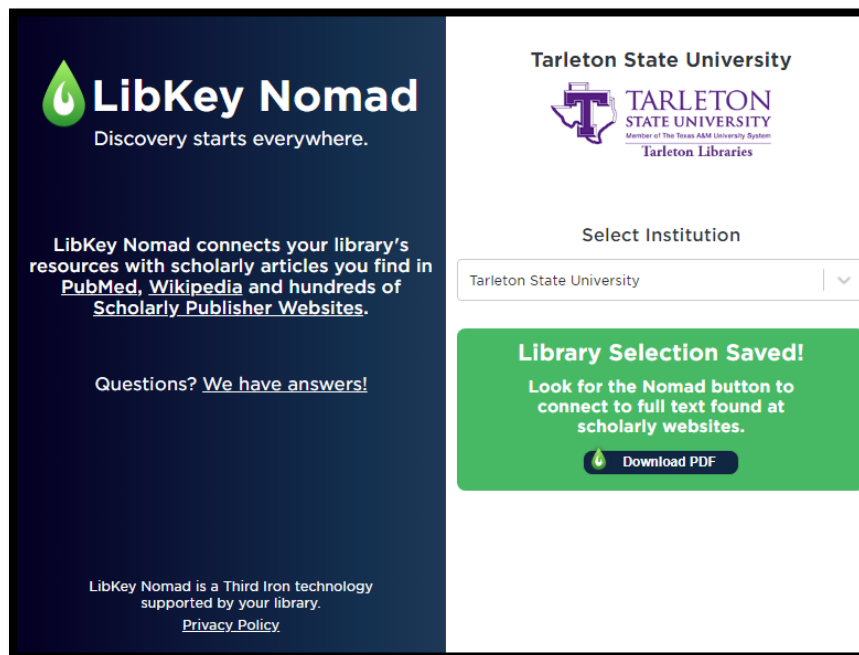
# LibKey Nomad

*Browser extension tool available for Chrome,  
Firefox, Edge, Vivaldi, and Brave*

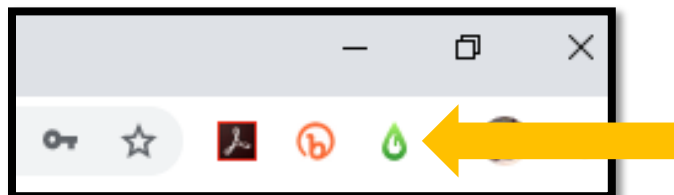
## User Setup Instructions

---

1. Visit the LibKey Nomad site at [www.libkeynomad.com](http://www.libkeynomad.com) to select your preferred browser from. You'll then be directed to that browser's download page to add the extension tool.
2. Click Add when prompted.
3. Select Institution - Select "Tarleton State University" from the drop down. The Tarleton logo will appear. You can then close the window. You are all set!



4. The LibKey Nomad logo (small green flame) will show up at top right of browser window.




5. When on an article page a button at the bottom left will appear that indicates options to access the article. For example, to immediately download the PDF of the article this button will appear.



You may also see “Article Link” which directs to the website with full-text access and “Access Options...” which routes to the Full Text Finder @ Tarleton menu for additional access options and Interlibrary Loan request.

6. LibKey Nomad links will also display in PubMed

Special enhancement is also performed in-line on sites like PubMed and Wikipedia.

After installation, LibKey Nomad prompts you to select your subscribing institution. After that, it simply automatically scans for scholarly content wherever you may roam.
