Computer & Database Login

Your Tarleton Network (NTNET) username and password let you log on to computers on all Tarleton campuses, including the Hickman and Schaffer buildings. When you're not on a Tarleton campus, your NTNET login gives you access to the library's databases, online books, digital media, online services, and more.

Courier Service

Students/faculty/staff at outreach campuses can get courier delivery of library materials by registering as an off-campus learner with the library and requesting items through interlibrary loan.

Library materials are delivered via courier to Fort Worth campuses (Hickman & Schaffer bldgs.), McLennan Library (Waco), and Navarro College (Midlothian).

Course Reserves

Some instructors put materials like outside readings and sample tests on reserve in the Stephenville campus library or online.

Online course reserves require a username and password, which your instructors must issue to you.

To see if an instructor has put items on reserve:

- Go to library homepage http://www.tarleton.edu/library.
- Click the "Course reserves" link (under Services).
- Search using an instructor's name or course ID or name.

Databases

To access the library's databases from off campus, you must have a valid NTNET login. See Tarleton Network Acct (NTNET).

Distance/Off-Campus Learners

Tarleton's official email is the go.tarleton.edu system. You'll need to claim your account to activate it. For instructions, go to http://www.tarleton.edu/technology/email.html.

Home & Office Delivery

If you do not live, work, or attend classes near Stephenville or a courier delivery location, you may be eligible for home/office delivery of library materials.

Register at <u>http://www.tarleton.edu/library/services/off-campus.html</u> to request that items be mailed to your home/office or sent to you, when possible, as PDF documents.

You will be responsible for returning borrowed items like books, CDs, and DVDs to the Stephenville campus library. Postage-paid labels will be provided.

Interlibrary Loan

You can request books, articles, and other items not available in the libraries' collections/databases with our interlibrary loan service.

To access your interlibrary loan account,

- Go to the library's homepage http://www.tarleton.edu/library.
- Click the "Interlibrary Ioan (ILL)" link (under Services).
- Click the "Login to Interlibrary Loan" link.
- Enter your NTNET (Tarleton Network) login.
