Organizational History

The West Texas Chamber of Commerce was founded in December 1918. The organizational meeting was called by Dr. C.C. Gumm and held in Fort Worth, Texas. Representatives of chambers of commerce from twenty-five counties and four cites attended. The purposes of the organization were to foster, promote, protect, and develop West Texas. The organization also looked to stimulate the prosperity and promote the general welfare of West Texas. The first regional convention was held in Mineral Springs, Texas in 1919. President C.T. Herring of Abilene presided. The regional headquarters were in Stamford, Texas from 1918 to 1937, when they moved to Amarillo, Texas. West Texas Today was the official publication. It was published quarterly from 1918 until 1922 when it became a monthly magazine. The West Texas Chamber of Commerce was involved in two mergers. In 1988 it merged with other regional chambers of commerce to become the Texas Chamber of Commerce. That organization merged with the Texas Association of Business in 1995 to become the Texas Association of Business and Chambers of Commerce.

The editor of the August 1926 issue was E.H. Whitehead. The issue spotlighted more than twenty educational institutions located in West Texas and was sent to more than one thousand West Texas high school graduates. The purpose of the issue was to reveal opportunities for advancement in the West Texas region. It also contained several articles about higher education in general. Of special interest is the full-page ad for John Tarleton Agricultural College (JTAC)

on the inside of the front cover. An article about JTAC titled "On Ye Tarleton" written by Vera Jean McNew is on pages 4-5, 52.
