

Students applying in fall 2019 for acceptance into pre-nursing in spring 2020 and for students applying in spring 2020 for acceptance into pre-nursing in fall 2020, this criteria applies.

Students applying in fall 2020 for acceptance into pre-nursing beginning spring 2021 and all subsequent semesters, other admission criteria applies (see other form).

Explanation of Application Process and Course Requirements

The process to apply for admission is a two-step, competitive process. The two-step process to enter the nursing program is separate from, and in addition to, the application to Tarleton. **Admission by Tarleton and the School of Nursing are required.** To be considered for nursing program admission, the individual **MUST** meet admission requirements and submit application materials to Tarleton and the School of Nursing by the specified deadlines. Due to issues with program capacity (limited faculty resources, clinical space, and lab space), meeting minimum requirements for each step is necessary, but not sufficient, to gain program admission. Licensed Vocational Nurses (LVNs) may apply for the BSN program of study in Stephenville.

Step I Selection for Tarleton Three Preadmission Nursing Courses (NURS 2355, 2360, and 2150)

1. Admission to Tarleton State University.
2. Completion of at least 50 general education and non-nursing prerequisite credits from a regionally accredited institution with a minimum grade of “C”.
3. Achieve a minimum GPA of 3.0 on completed designed English and Science prerequisite courses (ENGL 1301 & 1302, CHEM 1407, BIOL 2401, 2402, and BIOL 2420).
4. Completion of **all four** required science courses (CHEM 1407, BIOL 2401, 2402, and BIOL 2420) is necessary to be considered for preadmission (pre-nursing) courses. This means if applying to start pre-nursing courses in the fall, **all four science courses must be completed by the spring** semester before. If applying to start pre-nursing courses in the spring, all four science courses must be completed by the fall semester before.
5. Achieve a minimum of 24 course points. (Point system information is available at www.tarleton.edu/nursing.)

Step II Nursing Program Application Process While Taking Preadmission Nursing Courses

1. Completion of the 56 general education and prerequisite credits from a regionally accredited institution with a minimum grade of a “C”. All courses (except an upper level elective) are to be completed prior to the first class day.
2. Achieve a minimum GPA of 3.0 on designated English and Science prerequisite courses [(a) ENGL 1301 & 1302; (b) CHEM 1407; (c) BIOL 2401 & 2402; (d) BIOL 2420] by the end of the semester enrolled in pre-admission (or pre-nursing) courses.
3. Completion of the three preadmission nursing courses (NURS 2355, 2360, and 2150) at Tarleton with a grade of “B” or better.
4. Achieve one of the following:
 - HESI A2 score \geq 80 (A&P, Math, English- Also required to take Critical Thinking and Learning Styles)
 - SAT math and verbal/reading only combined score \geq 1180
 - ACT score \geq 24

Only scores from within 5 years and submitted directly from an authorized testing center will be accepted.

5. Achieve a minimum of 100 selected points (Course, GPA, and Entry Test points) before the residency points are added.

Residency points are added after subtotal points are ranked in descending order. Students with the highest points and on-time submission of application will be accepted until the available admission slots are filled. ***Admission to the nursing program is highly competitive and admission is not guaranteed.*** The point calculation worksheet is located at www.tarleton.edu/nursing.

6. Be eligible for RN licensure upon graduation. Must receive criminal background clearance by the Texas Board of Nursing and answer *no* to eligibility questions or receive a Declaratory Order before acceptance (see part IV of the School of Nursing application for more details).

For Step I, submit Permission to Register for Preadmission Courses form to the Nursing Office by **March 15 to be considered for fall admission** or **October 15 to be considered for spring semester** (process information and form are available online at www.tarleton.edu/nursing).

For Step II, in addition to being eligible for RN licensure, submit all application materials (application, narrative, and reference forms), and nursing program admission test score (HESI, SAT, or ACT), by **March 15 to be considered for fall admission** or **October 15 to be considered for spring semester**. A copy of the receipt of payment for the application see should accompany your application materials. Admission packet will not be accepted without receipt.
